A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the authority of the Public Utility Commission of Texas
- 3 to address market power abuse, including the right to order
- 4 restitution for violations.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 39.157, Utilities Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (a) The commission shall monitor market power associated
- 10 with the generation, transmission, distribution, and sale of
- 11 electricity in this state. On a finding that market power abuses or
- 12 other violations of this section are occurring, the commission
- 13 shall require reasonable mitigation of the market power by ordering
- 14 the construction of additional transmission or distribution
- 15 facilities, by seeking an injunction or civil penalties as
- 16 necessary to eliminate or to remedy the market power abuse or
- 17 violation as authorized by Chapter 15, by ordering a person to cease
- 18 a practice that the commission finds is a market power abuse, by
- 19 imposing an administrative penalty as authorized by Chapter 15, or
- 20 by suspending, revoking, or amending a certificate or registration
- 21 as authorized by Section 39.356. Section 15.024(c) does not apply
- 22 to an administrative penalty imposed under this section. In lieu of
- 23 assessing an administrative penalty as authorized by Section 15.024
- 24 and this section, the commission may order any person found to have

committed market power abuse to refund to entities directly 1 2 affected by the abuse an amount not to exceed the greater of the 3 administrative penalty that would otherwise be ordered by the commission or one hundred and fifteen percent of the amount of 4 additional profit that the person received as a result of the market 5 power abuse. For purposes of this subchapter, market power abuses 6 7 are practices by persons possessing market power that unreasonably discriminatory or tend to unreasonably restrict, 8 9 impair, or reduce the level of competition, including practices that tie unregulated products or services to regulated products or 10 11 services or unreasonably discriminate in the provision of regulated services. For purposes of this section, "market power abuses" 12 13 include predatory pricing, withholding of production, precluding entry, and collusion. A violation of the code of conduct provided 14 15 by Subsection (d) that materially impairs the ability of a person to 16 compete in a competitive market shall be deemed to be an abuse of market power. The possession of a high market share in a market 17 open to competition may not, of itself, be deemed to be an abuse of 18 market power; however, this sentence shall not affect 19 20 application of state and federal antitrust laws.

- 21 <u>(a-1)</u> The office shall be permitted to intervene in any 22 proceeding concerning market power abuse or market manipulation.
- 23 (a-2) Following a proceeding related to market power abuse
 24 in which the commission determines that refunds are appropriate,
 25 the commission shall conduct a proceeding to determine the proper
 26 method of distributing the refunds to entities directly affected by
 27 the market power abuse. Any entity directly affected by the abuse

1 may intervene in the proceeding.

effect for that purpose.

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- SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to a violation that occurs or continues to occur on or after the effective date of this Act. A violation that occurred before the effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect at the time the violation occurred, and the former law is continued in
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
