A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the creation of an offense for certain uses of a

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Alex Brown Memorial
- 6 Act.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 545.425(a), Transportation Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Subdivision (1-a) to read as follows:
- 9 (1-a) "Text-based communication" means a
- 10 communication sent from a wireless communication device for the
- 11 purpose of manually communicating with another person in a written
- 12 medium. The term includes:
- (A) a text message;
- 14 (B) an instant message; and
- (C) e-mail.
- SECTION 3. Section 545.425, Transportation Code, is amended
- 17 by amending Subsection (b-1) and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as
- 18 follows:
- 19 (b-1) A municipality, county, or other political
- 20 subdivision that enforces Subsection (b) [this section] shall post
- 21 a sign that complies with the standards described by this
- 22 subsection at the entrance to each school crossing zone in the

- 1 (1) allow for a sign required to be posted under this
- 2 subsection to be attached to an existing sign at a minimal cost; and
- 3 (2) require that a sign required to be posted under
- 4 this subsection inform an operator that:
- 5 (A) the use of a wireless communication device is
- 6 prohibited in the school crossing zone; and
- 7 (B) the operator is subject to a fine if the
- 8 operator uses a wireless communication device in the school
- 9 crossing zone.
- 10 <u>(c-1)</u> An operator may not use a wireless communication
- 11 device to read, write, or send a text-based communication while
- 12 operating a motor vehicle unless the vehicle is stopped.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
