A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to education and training for school district peace
3	officers, school resource officers, and school security personnel
4	employed by a school district.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter M, Chapter 1701,
7	Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER M. SCHOOL [VISITING] RESOURCE OFFICERS AND [OFFICER IN
9	PUBLIC] SCHOOL DISTRICT PEACE OFFICERS
10	SECTION 2. Subchapter M, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
11	amended by adding Sections 1701.604 and 1701.605 to read as
12	follows:
13	Sec. 1701.604. EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAM. (a) A peace
14	officer may not serve as a school resource officer unless the
15	officer has completed a 20-hour education and training program
16	administered by the commission.
17	(b) The Texas Education Agency, in consultation with the
18	commission, shall develop the curriculum for the education and
19	training program. The commission must approve the curriculum
20	before the commission administers the program.
21	(c) The curriculum for the education and training program
22	must incorporate learning objectives regarding:
23	(1) child and adolescent development and psychology;
24	(2) positive behavioral interventions and supports,

- 1 conflict resolution techniques, and restorative justice
- 2 techniques;
- 3 (3) force usage limitations, including physical
- 4 restraint, and de-escalation techniques;
- 5 (4) children with disabilities or special needs; and
- 6 (5) cultural competency.
- 7 (d) The education and training program may be provided as an
- 8 online course. The commission may offer the education and training
- 9 program as part of the training program maintained under Subchapter
- 10 <u>F.</u>
- 11 (e) The Texas Education Agency, in consultation with the
- 12 commission, shall review the education and training program,
- 13 including the curriculum developed under Subsection (b), at least
- 14 once every 24 months.
- 15 (f) A school district may provide additional,
- 16 commission-approved preparatory education or training to its
- 17 school resource officers and school district peace officers.
- Sec. 1701.605. CONTINUING EDUCATION. (a) As part of the
- 19 continuing education required by Section 1701.351, each school
- 20 resource officer and school district peace officer shall complete
- 21 at least eight hours of continuing education described by this
- 22 <u>section.</u>
- 23 (b) The commission shall provide to school resource
- 24 officers or school district peace officers continuing education
- 25 that incorporates the learning objectives specified under Section
- 26 1701.604(c). The continuing education may be provided online.
- (c) Notwithstanding Section 1701.351(a), the commission may

- 1 not suspend the license of a peace officer solely because the peace
- 2 officer fails to meet the requirements of this section.
- 3 (d) Notwithstanding Section 1701.351(c), a school resource
- 4 officer or school district peace officer who serves at least 12
- 5 months in the United States military or as an elected member of the
- 6 legislature during a period for which the officer is required to
- 7 complete continuing education under this section must complete the
- 8 required continuing education not later than the second anniversary
- 9 of the date the officer returns to work at a school district.
- SECTION 3. Section 37.081, Education Code, is amended by
- 11 adding Subsections (i) and (j) to read as follows:
- 12 (i) A person may not be employed as security personnel for a
- 13 school district unless the person has successfully completed the
- 14 education and training program under Section 1701.604, Occupations
- 15 <u>Code.</u>
- (j) Except as provided by Section 1701.605(d), Occupations
- 17 Code, a person employed or under contract as security personnel
- 18 under this section must successfully complete the continuing
- 19 education described by Section 1701.605, Occupations Code, to
- 20 continue to serve as security personnel for a school district.
- SECTION 4. Not later than December 31, 2011, the Texas
- 22 Education Agency shall develop the curriculum for the education and
- 23 training program as required by Section 1701.604(b), Occupations
- 24 Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 5. Not later than March 31, 2012, the Commission on
- 26 Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education shall adopt rules
- 27 for the administration of the education and training program

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- 1 required by Section 1701.604, Occupations Code, as added by this
- 2 Act, and for providing continuing education required by Section
- 3 1701.605, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 4 SECTION 6. (a) Section 1701.604, Occupations Code, as
- 5 added by this Act, and Section 37.081, Education Code, as amended by
- 6 this Act, apply only to a school district peace officer, school
- 7 resource officer, or security personnel member who is initially
- 8 appointed, commissioned, or employed by a school district to serve
- 9 in that capacity on or after March 31, 2012.
- 10 (b) A school district peace officer or school resource
- 11 officer serving in that capacity immediately before the effective
- 12 date of this Act is not required to comply with the continuing
- 13 education requirements described by Section 1701.605, Occupations
- 14 Code, as added by this Act, for any license renewal that occurs
- 15 before January 1, 2014.
- 16 (c) A person employed by a school district as security
- 17 personnel immediately before the effective date of this Act is not
- 18 required to comply with Section 37.081(j), Education Code, as added
- 19 by this Act, as a condition of continued employment in that capacity
- 20 before January 1, 2014.
- 21 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
