- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.351(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The commissioner shall adopt a recommended appraisal
- 8 process and criteria on which to appraise the performance of
- 9 teachers. The commissioner may not adopt or develop a recommended
- 10 appraisal process and criteria based on any federally enacted or
- 11 nationally applicable appraisal criteria incorporating the results
- 12 of student performance on assessment instruments. The criteria
- 13 must be based on observable, job-related behavior, including:
- 14 (1) teachers' implementation of discipline management
- 15 procedures; and
- 16 (2) the performance of teachers' students.
- SECTION 2. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by
- 18 adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), (b-3), and (b-4) to read as
- 19 follows:
- 20 (b-1) In this section, "national curriculum standards"
- 21 includes any curriculum standards endorsed, approved, sanctioned,
- 22 or promoted by the United States Department of Education, the
- 23 National Governors Association, or the Council of Chief State
- 24 School Officers.

- 1 (b-2) The State Board of Education may not adopt national
- 2 curriculum standards to comply with a duty imposed under this
- 3 chapter.
- 4 (b-3) A school district may not use national curriculum
- 5 standards to comply with the requirement to provide instruction in
- 6 the essential knowledge and skills at appropriate grade levels
- 7 <u>under Subsection (c).</u>
- 8 (b-4) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, a
- 9 school district or open-enrollment charter school may not be
- 10 required to offer any aspect of a national curriculum.
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by
- 12 adding Subsection (a-2) to read as follows:
- 13 (a-2) The agency may not adopt or develop a
- 14 criterion-referenced assessment instrument under this section
- 15 based on national curriculum standards as defined by Section
- 16 28.002(b-1).
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
