## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to regulation of the practice of therapeutic optometry.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 351.002(8), Occupations Code, is amended
5	to read as follows:
6	(8) "Surgery" means a procedure using instruments,
7	including <u>needles</u> that penetrate the globe of the eye, lasers, $\underline{\text{or}}$
8	scalpels, [or needles,] in which human tissue is cut, burned, or
9	vaporized[, or otherwise altered] by any mechanical means, laser,

- SECTION 2. Section 351.260, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

- (d) A faculty member of an institution of higher education in this state who provides instruction in optometry or therapeutic optometry and holds a license under this chapter may, in the course of teaching, perform and teach any procedure that may be lawfully performed by a licensed optometrist, therapeutic optometrist, or optometric physician in any other state.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter H, Chapter 351, Occupations Code, is

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- 1 amended by adding Sections 351.368 and 351.369 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 351.368. SCOPE OF PRACTICE OF THERAPEUTIC OPTOMETRIST.
- 3 (a) A therapeutic optometrist may diagnose any disease, condition,
- 4 or disorder of the eye, adnexa, or visual system by any appropriate
- 5 means.
- 6 (b) A therapeutic optometrist may treat any disease,
- 7 condition, or disorder of the eye, adnexa, or visual system by any
- 8 appropriate means other than surgery.
- 9 (c) A therapeutic optometrist may administer or prescribe
- 10 any medication using any means of administration that is reasonably
- 11 related to the diagnosis or treatment of the eye, adnexa, or visual
- 12 system. A therapeutic optometrist may not prescribe a controlled
- 13 substance that is listed, as of September 1, 2011, in Schedule I or
- 14 Schedule II of the Comprehensive Drug Abuse Prevention and Control
- 15 Act of 1970 (21 U.S.C. Section 801 et seq.).
- 16 <u>(d) In addition to the professional designations listed in</u>
- 17 Section 104.003, a therapeutic optometrist may use the professional
- 18 designation "optometric glaucoma specialist" or "optometric

- 20 <u>Sec. 351.369. AUTHORIZED NONINVASIVE SURGICAL PR</u>OCEDURES
- 21 PERFORMED BY THERAPEUTIC OPTOMETRIST. A therapeutic optometrist
- 22 may perform the following noninvasive surgical procedures:
- 23 (1) remove a superficial foreign body in the
- 24 conjunctiva, eyelid, or corneal epithelium that has not perforated
- 25 the Bowman's membrane;
- 26 (2) use tissue glue to close a wound;
- 27 (3) perform cultures or smears for diagnosis;

1	(4) pull eyelashes or remove irregular eyelashes with
2	electrolysis;
3	(5) dilate, irrigate, or probe the lacrimal passages;
4	(6) place and remove punctal plugs;
5	(7) administer medication by injection, other than an
6	injection that penetrates the globe of the eye;
7	(8) remove loose epithelium to promote healing;
8	(9) drain an abscess or cyst;
9	(10) remove small bumps from the eyelid;
10	(11) close the puncta by cautery;
11	(12) perform any glaucoma treatment procedure,
12	including glaucoma treatment procedures using lasers, other than
13	intraocular surgery by blade;
14	(13) provide postoperative care, including laser
15	<pre>capsulotomy; and</pre>
16	(14) perform any other noninvasive surgical procedure
17	approved by the board.
18	SECTION 4. Section 483.021(b), Health and Safety Code, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	(b) A pharmacist who is requested to dispense a dangerous
21	drug under a prescription issued by a therapeutic optometrist shall
22	determine, in the exercise of the pharmacist's professional
23	judgment, whether the prescription is for a dangerous drug that a
24	therapeutic optometrist is authorized to prescribe under Section
25	351.368 [351.358], Occupations Code.
26	SECTION 5. The following laws are repealed:
27	(1) Section 351.160. Occupations Code:

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- 1 (2) Section 351.165, Occupations Code;
- 2 (3) Section 351.358, Occupations Code; and
- 3 (4) Section 351.3581, Occupations Code.
- 4 SECTION 6. Chapter 351, Occupations Code, as amended by
- 5 this Act, may not be construed as preventing a therapeutic
- 6 optometrist from performing a procedure or administering or
- 7 prescribing any medication that could legally be performed,
- 8 administered, or prescribed by a therapeutic optometrist
- 9 immediately before the passage of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
