- relating to an annual state budget and legislative budget sessions 2
- in even-numbered years and to political contributions made during a 3
- legislative session. 4
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 301.001, Government Code, is amended to
- read as follows: 7
- Sec. 301.001. TIME OF MEETING. (a) In each odd-numbered 8
- 9 year, the [The] legislature shall convene in regular session at 12
- noon on the second Tuesday in January [of each odd-numbered year]. 10
- 11 (b) In each even-numbered year, the legislature shall
- 12 convene in budget session at 12 noon on the third Tuesday in April.
- SECTION 2. Section 316.001, Government Code, is amended to 13
- 14 read as follows:
- Sec. 316.001. LIMIT. The rate of growth of appropriations 15
- 16 in a state fiscal year [biennium] from state tax revenues not
- dedicated by the constitution may not exceed the estimated rate of 17
- growth of the state's economy. 18
- SECTION 3. Sections 316.002(a), (b), and (e), Government 19
- Code, are amended to read as follows: 20
- 21 Before the Legislative Budget Board submits the budget
- as prescribed by Section 322.008(c), the board shall establish: 22
- 23 (1) the estimated rate of growth of the state's economy
- 24 from the current fiscal year [biennium] to the next fiscal year

- 1 [biennium];
- 2 (2) the level of appropriations for the current <u>fiscal</u>
- 3 <u>year</u> [biennium] from state tax revenues not dedicated by the
- 4 constitution; and
- 5 (3) the amount of state tax revenues not dedicated by
- 6 the constitution that could be appropriated for the next <u>fiscal</u>
- 7 <u>year</u> [biennium] within the limit established by the estimated rate
- 8 of growth of the state's economy.
- 9 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), the board shall
- 10 determine the estimated rate of growth of the state's economy by
- 11 dividing the estimated Texas total personal income for the next
- 12 fiscal year [biennium] by the estimated Texas total personal income
- 13 for the current fiscal year [biennium]. Using standard statistical
- 14 methods, the board shall make the estimate by projecting through
- 15 the <u>fiscal year</u> [biennium] the estimated Texas total personal
- 16 income reported by the United States Department of Commerce or its
- 17 successor in function.
- 18 (e) In the absence of an action by the Legislative Budget
- 19 Board to adopt a spending limit as provided in Subsections (a) and
- 20 (b), the estimated rate of growth in the state's economy from the
- 21 current <u>fiscal year</u> [biennium] to the next <u>fiscal year</u> [biennium]
- 22 shall be treated as if it were zero, and the amount of state tax
- 23 revenues not dedicated by the constitution that could be
- 24 appropriated within the limit established by the estimated rate of
- 25 growth in the state's economy shall be the same as the level of
- 26 appropriations for the current fiscal year [biennium].
- SECTION 4. Section 316.008(a), Government Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (a) Unless the legislature adopts a resolution under
- 3 Article VIII, Section 22(b), of the Texas Constitution raising the
- 4 proposed limit on appropriations, the proposed limit is binding on
- 5 the legislature with respect to all appropriations for the next
- 6 <u>fiscal year</u> [biennium] made from state tax revenues not dedicated
- 7 by the constitution.
- 8 SECTION 5. Section 317.003(a), Government Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (a) The governor or Legislative Budget Board may make a
- 11 proposal at any time except during a [regular or special] session of
- 12 the legislature. A proposal may apply to an appropriation that has
- 13 been made for any specified fiscal year that has not ended at the
- 14 time the proposal is made.
- 15 SECTION 6. Chapter 322, Government Code, is amended by
- 16 adding Section 322.021 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 322.021. STUDY TO IMPLEMENT ANNUAL BUDGET. (a) The
- 18 board, with the assistance of the Texas Legislative Council, shall
- 19 examine the laws and operations of state government to determine
- 20 how the implementation of annual state budgets may affect those
- 21 laws and operations and shall adopt recommendations for legislative
- 22 and administrative action necessary to implement an annual budget
- 23 <u>as effectively as practicable.</u>
- 24 (b) The board shall make its initial recommendations under
- 25 this section not later than November 1, 2014.
- SECTION 7. Section 403.121(a), Government Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

- 1 In the statement required by Article III, Section 49a, of the Texas Constitution the comptroller shall list outstanding 2 3 appropriations that may exist after the end of the current fiscal year but may not deduct them from the cash condition of the treasury 4 5 or the anticipated revenues of the next fiscal year [biennium] for the purpose of certification. The comptroller shall base the 6 reports, estimates, and certifications of available funds on the 7 8 actual or estimated cash condition of the treasury and shall consider outstanding and undisbursed appropriations at the end of 9 10 each <u>fiscal year</u> [biennium] as probable disbursements of the succeeding fiscal year [biennium] in the same manner that earned 11 12 but uncollected income of a current fiscal year [biennium] is considered in probable receipts of the succeeding <u>fiscal year</u> 13 14 [biennium]. The comptroller shall consider 15 disbursements warrants that will be issued by the state before the end of the fiscal year. 16
- 17 SECTION 8. The heading to Section 253.034, Election Code, 18 is amended to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 253.034. RESTRICTIONS ON CONTRIBUTIONS DURING AND 20 FOLLOWING REGULAR OR BUDGET [LEGISLATIVE] SESSION OF LEGISLATURE.
- SECTION 9. Section 253.034, Election Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), and (c) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- (a) During the period beginning on the 30th day before the date a regular [legislative] session of the legislature convenes and continuing through the 20th day after the date of final adjournment of that regular session, a person may not knowingly

- 2 (1) a statewide officeholder;
- 3 (2) a member of the legislature; or
- 4 (3) a specific-purpose committee for supporting,
- $\,$ 5 $\,$ opposing, or assisting a statewide officeholder or member of the $\,$
- 6 legislature.
- 7 (a-1) During a budget session of the legislature, a person
- 8 may not knowingly make a political contribution to:
- 9 (1) the governor or lieutenant governor;
- 10 (2) a member of or a candidate for election to the
- 11 legislature; or
- 12 (3) a specific-purpose committee for supporting,
- 13 opposing, or assisting the governor, the lieutenant governor, or a
- 14 member of or a candidate for election to the legislature.
- 15 (b) A statewide officeholder, a member of or a candidate for
- 16 <u>election to</u> the legislature, or a specific-purpose committee for
- 17 supporting, opposing, or assisting a statewide officeholder or a
- 18 member of or candidate for election to the legislature may not
- 19 knowingly accept a political contribution, and shall refuse a
- 20 political contribution that is received, during an applicable [the]
- 21 period prescribed by Subsection (a) or (a-1). A political
- 22 contribution that is received and refused during that period shall
- 23 be returned to the contributor not later than the 30th day after the
- 24 date of receipt. A contribution made by United States mail or by
- 25 common or contract carrier is not considered received during a
- 26 [that] period if it was properly addressed and placed with postage
- 27 or carrier charges prepaid or prearranged in the mail or delivered

- 1 to the contract carrier before the beginning of the period. The
- 2 date indicated by the post office cancellation mark or the common or
- 3 contract carrier documents is considered to be the date the
- 4 contribution was placed in the mail or delivered to the common or
- 5 contract carrier unless proven otherwise.
- 6 (c) This section does not apply to a political contribution
- 7 that was made and accepted with the intent that it be used:
- 8 (1) in an election held or ordered during a [the]
- 9 period prescribed by Subsection (a) or (a-1) in which the person
- 10 accepting the contribution is a candidate if the contribution was
- 11 made after the person appointed a campaign treasurer with the
- 12 appropriate authority and before the person was sworn in for that
- 13 office;
- 14 (2) to defray expenses incurred in connection with an
- 15 election contest; or
- 16 (3) by a person who holds a state office or a member of
- 17 the legislature or by a specific-purpose political committee that
- 18 supports or assists only that person or member if the contribution
- 19 was made during the period prescribed by Subsection (a) and the
- 20 person or member was defeated at the general election held
- 21 immediately before the regular session is convened [or by a
- 22 specific-purpose political committee that supports or assists only
- 23 that person or member].
- SECTION 10. The heading to Section 253.0341, Election Code,
- 25 is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 253.0341. RESTRICTIONS ON CONTRIBUTIONS TO
- 27 LEGISLATIVE CAUCUSES DURING AND FOLLOWING REGULAR OR BUDGET

- 1 [LECISLATIVE] SESSION OF LEGISLATURE.
- 2 SECTION 11. Sections 253.0341(a) and (b), Election Code,
- 3 are amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) During the period beginning on the 30th day before the
- 5 date a regular [legislative] session of the legislature convenes
- 6 and continuing through the 20th day after the date of final
- 7 adjournment, or at any time during a budget session of the
- 8 legislature, a person not a member of the caucus may not knowingly
- 9 make a contribution to a legislative caucus.
- 10 (b) A legislative caucus may not knowingly accept from a
- 11 nonmember a contribution, and shall refuse a contribution from a
- 12 nonmember that is received, during a [the] period prescribed by
- 13 Subsection (a). A contribution that is received and refused during
- 14 a [that] period prescribed by Subsection (a) shall be returned to
- 15 the contributor not later than the 30th day after the date of
- 16 receipt. A contribution made by United States mail or by common or
- 17 contract carrier is not considered received during a [that] period
- 18 if it was properly addressed and placed with postage or carrier
- 19 charges prepaid or prearranged in the mail or delivered to the
- 20 contract carrier before the beginning of the period. The date
- 21 indicated by the post office cancellation mark or the common or
- 22 contract carrier documents is considered to be the date the
- 23 contribution was placed in the mail or delivered to the common or
- 24 contract carrier unless proven otherwise.
- 25 SECTION 12. The changes in law made by this Act do not
- 26 affect the validity of an appropriation made before September 1,
- 27 2015, for any part of the two consecutive state fiscal years ending

- 1 August 31, 2017.
- 2 SECTION 13. (a) This Act takes effect as provided by
- 3 Subsection (b), but only if the constitutional amendment proposed
- 4 by the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, providing for an
- 5 annual state budget and annual legislative sessions for budget
- 6 purposes is approved by the voters. If that proposed
- 7 constitutional amendment is not approved by the voters, this Act
- 8 has no effect.
- 9 (b) This section and Section 6 of this Act take effect
- 10 January 1, 2014. The other sections of this Act take effect
- 11 September 1, 2015.
