## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of the practice of physical therapy.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 453.301, Occupations Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 453.301. TREATING PATIENT WITHIN SCOPE OF PRACTICE
7	[UNDER PRIOR REFERRAL]. (a) A physical therapist may treat a
8	patient for an injury or condition that is within the physical
9	therapist's scope of practice under Section 453.005 without a [was
10	the subject of a prior   referral if the physical therapist:
11	(1) has been licensed to practice physical therapy for
12	at least one year;
13	(2) <u>is covered by professional liability insurance in</u>
14	the minimum amount required by board rule [notifies the referring
15	practitioner of the therapy not later than the fifth business day
16	after the date therapy is begun]; and
17	(3) <u>either:</u>
18	(A) possesses a doctoral degree in physical
19	therapy from:
20	(i) a program that is accredited by the
21	Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education; or
22	(ii) an institution that is accredited by
23	an agency or association recognized by the United States secretary
24	of education; or

- 1 (B) has completed at least 30 hours of continuing
- 2 competence activities in the area of differential diagnosis.
- 3 (a-1) A physical therapist may treat a patient under
- 4 Subsection (a) [begins any episode of treatment before the first
- 5 anniversary of the referral by the referring practitioner;
- 6 [(4) for physical therapy episodes subsequent to the
- 7 episode which was initiated by the referral, treats the patient]
- 8 for not more than 20 treatment sessions or 45  $[\frac{30}{30}]$  consecutive
- 9 calendar days, whichever occurs first [; and
- 10 [(5) satisfies any other requirement set by the
- 11 board].
- 12 (b) The physical therapist must obtain a referral from a
- 13 [confer with the] referring practitioner before the physical
- 14 therapist may continue treatment that exceeds treatment authorized
- 15 under Subsection (a-1) [(a)(4)].
- SECTION 2. Section 453.351(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (a) The board may deny a license or suspend or revoke a
- 19 license, place a license holder on probation, reprimand a license
- 20 holder, impose an administrative penalty, or otherwise discipline a
- 21 license holder if the applicant or license holder has:
- (1) except as provided by Section [453.301 or]
- 23 453.302, provided care [physical therapy] to a person outside the
- 24 scope of the physical therapist's practice [without a referral from
- 25 <u>a referring practitioner</u>];
- 26 (2) used drugs or intoxicating liquors to an extent
- 27 that affects the license holder's or applicant's professional

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- 1 competence;
- 2 (3) been convicted of a felony, including a finding or
- 3 verdict of guilty, an admission of guilt, or a plea of nolo
- 4 contendere, in this state or in any other state or nation;
- 5 (4) obtained or attempted to obtain a license by fraud
- 6 or deception;
- 7 (5) been grossly negligent in the practice of physical
- 8 therapy or in acting as a physical therapist assistant;
- 9 (6) been found to be mentally incompetent by a court;
- 10 (7) practiced physical therapy in a manner detrimental
- 11 to the public health and welfare;
- 12 (8) had a license to practice physical therapy revoked
- 13 or suspended or had other disciplinary action taken against the
- 14 license holder or applicant;
- 15 (9) had the license holder's or applicant's
- 16 application for a license refused, revoked, or suspended by the
- 17 proper licensing authority of another state or nation; or
- 18 (10) in the case of a physical therapist assistant,
- 19 treated a person other than under the direction of a physical
- 20 therapist.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
