9	nine or above an elective course on firearm safety, training, and

11	(b) The purpose of a course under this section is to teach
12	the history and importance of the Second Amendment to the United
13	States Constitution and to teach respect for and proper use of
14	firearms. A course under this section must include:
15	(1) instruction on the Second Amendment to the United
16	States Constitution;
17	(2) instruction on firearm safety;
18	(3) training in the use of firearms, including the
19	safe use of common firearms such as pistols, revolvers, rifles, and

21	(4) instruction on firearm maintenance and cleaning;

(c) If a school district offers a course under this section,

(5) instruction on hunter safety.

- 3 (1) a qualified handgun instructor certified under
- 4 Section 411.190, Government Code; or
- 5 (2) a peace officer who is licensed under Chapter
- 6 $\underline{1701}$, Occupations Code, and who is employed by a local law
- 7 <u>enforcement agency.</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014
- 9 school year.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
