A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the Texas Racing Commission's ability to share

- 3 investigatory information with other state regulatory agencies.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2.15, Texas Racing Act (Article 179e,
- 6 Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 2.15. RECORDS. (a) All records of the commission that
- 8 are not made confidential by other law are open to inspection by the
- 9 public during regular office hours. All applications for a license
- 10 under this Act shall be maintained by the commission and shall be
- 11 available for public inspection during regular office hours.
- 12 <u>(b)</u> The contents of the investigatory files of the
- 13 commission[, however,] are not public records and are confidential
- 14 except in a criminal proceeding, in a hearing conducted by the
- 15 commission, on court order, or with the consent of the party being
- 16 investigated.
- 17 <u>(c)</u> The commission may share with another regulatory agency
- 18 of this state any investigatory file information that creates a
- 19 reasonable suspicion of a person's violation of a law or rule under
- 20 that agency's jurisdiction. The agency may use the information as
- 21 if it was obtained through that agency's investigatory process.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
