- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 61.001, Natural Resources Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Subdivision (4-a) to read as follows:
- 7 (4-a) "Launch" and "space flight activities" have the
- 8 meanings assigned by Section 100A.001, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 9 Code.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 61.011(d), Natural Resources Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (d) The commissioner shall promulgate rules, consistent
- 13 with the policies established in this section, on the following
- 14 matters only:
- 15 (1) acquisition by local governments or other
- 16 appropriate entities or public dedication of access ways sufficient
- 17 to provide adequate public ingress and egress to and from the beach
- 18 within the area described in Subdivision (6);
- 19 (2) protection of the public easement from erosion or
- 20 reduction caused by development or other activities on adjacent
- 21 land and beach cleanup and maintenance;
- 22 (3) local government prohibitions of vehicular
- 23 traffic on public beaches, provision of off-beach parking, the use
- 24 on a public beach of a golf cart, as defined by Section 502.001,

- 1 Transportation Code, for the transportation of a person with a
- 2 physical disability, and other minimum measures needed to mitigate
- 3 for any adverse effect on public access and dune areas;
- 4 (4) imposition of beach access, user, or parking fees
- 5 and reasonable exercises of the police power by local governments
- 6 with respect to public beaches;
- 7 (5) contents and certification of beach access and use
- 8 plans and standards for local government review of construction on
- 9 land adjacent to and landward of public beaches, including
- 10 procedures for expedited review of beach access and use plans under
- 11 Section 61.015;
- 12 (6) construction on land adjacent to and landward of
- 13 public beaches and lying in the area either up to the first public
- 14 road generally parallel to the beach or to any closer public road
- 15 not parallel to the beach, or to within 1,000 feet of mean high
- 16 tide, whichever is greater, that affects or may affect public
- 17 access to and use of public beaches;
- 18 (7) the temporary suspension under Section 61.0185 of
- 19 enforcement of the prohibition against encroachments on and
- 20 interferences with the public beach easement and the ability of a
- 21 property owner to make repairs to a house while a suspension is in
- 22 effect;
- 23 (8) the determination of the line of vegetation or
- 24 natural line of vegetation;
- 25 (9) the factors to be considered in determining
- 26 whether a structure, improvement, obstruction, barrier, or hazard
- 27 on the public beach:

- 1 (A) constitutes an imminent hazard to safety,
- 2 health, or public welfare; or
- 3 (B) substantially interferes with the free and
- 4 unrestricted right of the public to enter or leave the public beach
- 5 or traverse any part of the public beach; [and]
- 6 (10) the procedures for determining whether a
- 7 structure is not insurable property for purposes of Section
- 8 2210.004, Insurance Code, because of the factors listed in
- 9 Subsection (h) of that section; and
- 10 (11) the closure of beaches for space flight
- 11 activities.
- 12 SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 61, Natural Resources
- 13 Code, is amended by adding Section 61.132 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 61.132. CLOSING OF BEACHES FOR SPACE FLIGHT
- 15 ACTIVITIES. (a) This section applies only to a county bordering on
- 16 the Gulf of Mexico or its tidewater limits that contains a launch
- 17 site the construction and operation of which have been approved in a
- 18 record of decision issued by the Federal Aviation Administration
- 19 following the preparation of an environmental impact statement by
- 20 that administration.
- 21 (b) A person planning to conduct a launch in a county to
- 22 which this section applies must submit to the commissioners court
- 23 proposed primary and backup launch dates for the launch.
- 24 (c) To protect the public health, safety, and welfare, the
- 25 <u>commissioners court by order may temporarily close a beach in</u>
- 26 reasonable proximity to the launch site or access points to the
- 27 beach in the county on a primary or backup launch date, subject to

- 1 Subsection (d).
- 2 (d) The commissioners court may not close a beach or access
- 3 points to the beach on a primary launch date consisting of any of
- 4 the following days without the approval of the land office:
- 5 (1) the Saturday or Sunday preceding Memorial Day;
- 6 (2) Memorial Day;
- 7 <u>(3)</u> July 4;
- 8 (4) Labor Day; or
- 9 (5) a Saturday or Sunday that is after Memorial Day but
- 10 before Labor Day.
- 11 (e) The commissioners court must comply with the county's
- 12 beach access and use plan adopted and certified under Section
- 13 61.015 and dune protection plan adopted and certified under Chapter
- 14 63 when closing a beach or access point under this section.
- 15 (f) The land office may:
- 16 (1) approve or deny a beach or access point closure
- 17 request under Subsection (d);
- 18 (2) enter into a memorandum of agreement with the
- 19 commissioners court of a county to which this section applies to
- 20 govern beach and access point closures made under this section; and
- 21 (3) adopt rules to govern beach and access point
- 22 <u>closures made under this section.</u>
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
