A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to requiring a personal financial literacy credit for
3	graduation under the recommended and advanced high school programs.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 28.002(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) Each school district that offers kindergarten through
8	grade 12 shall offer, as a required curriculum:
9	(1) a foundation curriculum that includes:
10	(A) English language arts;
11	(B) mathematics;
12	(C) science; and
13	(D) social studies, consisting of Texas, United
14	States, and world history, government, economics, with emphasis on
15	the free enterprise system and its benefits, [and] geography, and
16	<pre>personal financial literacy; and</pre>
17	(2) an enrichment curriculum that includes:
18	(A) to the extent possible, languages other than
19	English;
20	(B) health, with emphasis on the importance of
21	proper nutrition and exercise;
22	(C) physical education;
23	(D) fine arts;
24	(E) career and technology education;

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- 1 (F) technology applications; and
- 2 (G) religious literature, including the Hebrew
- 3 Scriptures (Old Testament) and New Testament, and its impact on
- 4 history and literature.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 28.0021(b), Education Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (b) Each school district and each open-enrollment charter
- 8 school that offers a high school program shall provide to a student
- 9 instruction in personal financial literacy in any course meeting
- 10 the requirements for <u>a social studies</u> [an economics] credit under
- 11 Section 28.025, using materials approved by the State Board of
- 12 Education. The instruction in personal financial literacy must
- 13 include instruction on completing the application for federal
- 14 student aid provided by the United States Department of
- 15 Education. In fulfilling the requirement to provide financial
- 16 literacy instruction under this section, a school district or
- 17 open-enrollment charter school may use an existing state, federal,
- 18 private, or nonprofit program that provides students without charge
- 19 the instruction described under this section. [Each district and
- 20 each open-enrollment charter school that offers a high school
- 21 program shall ensure that a district or charter school student
- 22 enrolled at an institution of higher education in a dual credit
- 23 course meeting the requirements for an economics credit under
- 24 Section 28.025 receives the instruction described under this
- 25 subsection.
- SECTION 3. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

- 1 (b-1) The State Board of Education by rule shall require
- 2 that:
- 3 (1) except as provided by Subsection (b-2), the
- 4 curriculum requirements for the recommended and advanced high
- 5 school programs under Subsection (a) include a requirement that
- 6 students successfully complete:
- 7 (A) four credits in each subject of the
- 8 foundation curriculum under Section 28.002(a)(1), including at
- 9 least one-half credit in government, [and] at least one-half credit
- 10 in economics, and at least one-half credit in personal financial
- 11 <u>literacy under Section 28.0021</u>, to meet the social studies
- 12 requirement;
- 13 (B) for the recommended high school program, two
- 14 credits in the same language in a language other than English under
- 15 Section 28.002(a)(2)(A) and, for the advanced high school program,
- 16 three credits in the same language in a language other than English
- 17 under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A); and
- 18 (C) for the recommended high school program, six
- 19 elective credits and, for the advanced high school program, five
- 20 elective credits;
- 21 (2) one or more credits offered in the required
- 22 curriculum for the recommended and advanced high school programs
- 23 include a research writing component; and
- 24 (3) the curriculum requirements for the minimum,
- 25 recommended, and advanced high school programs under Subsection (a)
- 26 include a requirement that students successfully complete:
- 27 (A) one credit in fine arts under Section

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- 1 28.002(a)(2)(D); and
- 2 (B) except as provided by Subsection (b-11), one
- 3 credit in physical education under Section 28.002(a)(2)(C).
- 4 SECTION 4. Sections 28.0021(b) and 28.025(b-1), Education
- 5 Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to students entering the
- 6 ninth grade during the 2013-2014 school year or a later school year.
- 7 For students entering a grade above ninth grade during the
- 8 2013-2014 school year, Sections 28.0021(b) and 28.025(b-1),
- 9 Education Code, as those sections existed before amendment by this
- 10 Act, apply, and those sections are continued in effect for that
- 11 purpose.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
