A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the Emerging Technology Fund.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 490, Government Code, is amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 SUBCHAPTER B. TEXAS EMERGING TECHNOLOGY ADVISORY COMMITTEE
- 7 Sec. 490.051. COMPOSITION OF COMMITTEE. The Texas Emerging
- 8 Technology Advisory Committee is composed of 15 17 members.
- 9 Sec. 490.052. APPOINTMENT TO COMMITTEE; NOMINATIONS. (a)
- 10 The governor shall appoint to the committee five 13 individuals
- 11 nominated as provided by Subsection (b).
- 12 (a-1) The lieutenant governor shall appoint $\underline{\text{five}}$ $\underline{\text{two}}$
- 13 individuals to the committee.
- 14 (a-2) The speaker of the house of representatives shall
- 15 appoint five two individuals to the committee.
- 16 (b) The following persons may nominate one or more
- 17 individuals who are industry leaders in this state or who are
- 18 nationally recognized leaders from public or private institutions
- 19 of higher education in this state for appointment to the committee:
- 20 (1) a president of a public or private institution of
- 21 higher education in this state;
- 22 (2) a representative of the governor's office involved
- 23 in economic development activities;
- 24 (3) a representative of the lieutenant governor's

- 1 office involved in economic development activities;
- 2 (4) a representative of the office of the speaker of
- 3 the house involved in economic development activities; and
- 4 (5) other persons considered appropriate by the
- 5 governor.
- 6 (c) The governor may prescribe a date after which a
- 7 nomination under Subsection (b) for appointment for the next term
- 8 will not be considered.
- 9 (d) If an insufficient number of qualified individuals are
- 10 nominated as provided by Subsection (b) before the date set by the
- 11 governor under Subsection (c), the governor, lieutenant governor,
- 12 or speaker of the house may appoint any qualified individual to the
- 13 board for that term.
- 14 Sec. 490.053. PRESIDING MEMBER. The governor, lieutenant
- 15 governor, and speaker of the house shall, in turn, appoint a
- 16 presiding member of the committee. The selection of the presiding
- 17 member will rotate between the governor, lieutenant governor, and
- 18 speaker of the house, and each presiding member chosen will serve a
- 19 two-year term.
- Sec. 490.054. TERMS. (a) Members of the committee
- 21 appointed by the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the
- 22 <u>house</u> serve staggered two-year terms, subject to the pleasure of
- 23 the appointing entity governor.
- 24 (b) Members of the committee appointed by the lieutenant
- 25 governor or the speaker of the house of representatives serve
- 26 two-year terms.
- Sec. 490.055. STAFF AND FUNDING. Necessary staff and

- 1 funding for the administration of the fund shall be provided by:
- 2 (1) the office of the governor; and
- 3 (2) gifts, grants, and donations for overhead expenses
- 4 to the office of the governor; and
- 5 (3) the advisory committee shall hire a fund manager
- 6 for the purpose of maintaining the Subchapter D grants.
- 7 Sec. 490.056. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FUNDING. (a) The <u>fund</u>
- 8 manager, with the advice of the regional centers of innovation and
- 9 commercialization, committee shall make recommendations, through
- 10 peer review and evaluation processes established by the advisory
- 11 committee, to the advisory board governor, lieutenant governor, and
- 12 speaker of the house of representatives for the award of money from
- 13 the fund as provided by this chapter.
- 14 (b) The committee may establish advisory panels of
- 15 knowledgeable individuals from industry, state government, or
- 16 academic occupations to assist in peer review activities under this
- 17 chapter. The final award will be made by the advisory board.
- 18 This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
