4	SECTION 1. Chapter 2054, Government Code, is amended by
5	adding Subchapter O to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER O. STATE CYBERSECURITY
7	Sec. 2054.551. CYBERSECURITY COORDINATOR. The executive
8	director shall designate an employee of the department as the state
9	cybersecurity coordinator to oversee cybersecurity matters for
10	this state.
11	Sec. 2054.552. PRIVATE INDUSTRY-GOVERNMENT COUNCIL. The
12	state cybersecurity coordinator may establish a council that
13	includes public and private sector leaders and cybersecurity
14	practitioners to collaborate on matters of cybersecurity
15	concerning this state.
16	Sec. 2054.553. CYBERSECURITY APPROVAL SEAL. The state
17	cybersecurity coordinator may establish a voluntary program that
18	recognizes private and public entities functioning with exemplary
19	cybersecurity practices.
20	Sec. 2054.554. RECOMMENDATIONS. The state cybersecurity
21	coordinator may implement any portion or all of the recommendations
22	made by the Cybersecurity, Education, and Economic Development
23	Council under Subchapter N.
24	SECTION 2. Not later than December 31, 2013, the executive

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1 director of the Department of Information Resources shall designate 2 a state cybersecurity coordinator, as required by Section 2054.551, 3 Government Code, as added by this Act.

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4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the 9 legislative session.
