Relating to certain conditions of, penalties for violating, or collection of information about protective orders issued in certain family violence, sexual assault or abuse, stalking, or trafficking cases.

Relating to the eligibility of certain inmates for release on medically recommended intensive supervision.

Relating to search warrants issued in this state and other states for certain customer data, communications, and other information held in electronic storage in this state and other states by providers of electronic communications services and remote computing services.

**SB 1292** Ellis | et al.  
Relating to DNA testing of biological evidence in certain capital cases.

**SB 1316** Whitmire  
Relating to the prosecution of the offense of indecency with a child.

Relating to requiring trauma-informed care training for certain staff of county and state juvenile facilities.

**SB 1522** Hegar  
Relating to the responsibility of the county to hold certain persons in county jail before a return or transfer of the person to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice.

**SB 1839** Whitmire  
Relating to the detention of certain juvenile offenders.

Relating to the recognition and validity of a license to carry a concealed handgun issued by another state.

Relating to caseloads for attorneys who are appointed to represent indigent defendants in criminal cases.

Relating to the manner in which a bail bond or personal bond is forfeited and circumstances under which a final judgment of forfeiture may be reformed.

**SB 786** Hinojosa  
Relating to warrants issued to obtain location information from wireless communications devices and to public access to law enforcement or prosecutor requests for certain related location or communication information.

**SB 876** Patrick  
Relating to the discharge of a surety's liability on a bail bond in a criminal case.

**SB 1234** Whitmire  
Relating to the establishment of progressive sanctions for students who fail to attend school and to the repeal of the offenses of failure to attend school and parent contributing to nonattendance.

Relating to certain criminal offenses concerning the unlawful transfer or purchase of certain weapons.

Relating to the development and use of a jail-based restoration of competency pilot program.
