Article 59.01(2), Code of Criminal Procedure, as amended by Chapters 427 (S.B. 529) and 1357 (S.B. 1451), Acts of the 6 7 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, is reenacted and amended to read as follows: 8 (2) "Contraband" 9 means property of any nature, including real, personal, tangible, or intangible, that is: 10 11 (A) used in the commission of: 12 (i) any first or second degree felony under 13 the Penal Code; 14 (ii) any felony under Section 15.031(b), 20.05, 21.11, 38.04, or Chapter 43, 20A, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 33A, or 15 16 35, Penal Code; (iii) any felony under The Securities Act 17 (Article 581-1 et seq., Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes); or 18 (iv) any offense under Chapter 49, Penal 19 Code, that is punishable as a felony of the third degree or state 20 jail felony, if the defendant has been previously convicted three 21 22 times of an offense under that chapter; (B) used or intended to be used in the commission 23 of: 24

1 (xii) any offense under Section 20.05, 2 Penal Code; or 3 (xiii) [<del>xiv</del>] an offense under Section 326.002, Business & Commerce Code; 4 5 (C) the proceeds gained from the commission of a felony listed in Paragraph (A) or (B) of this subdivision, a 6 misdemeanor listed in Paragraph (B)(vii), (ix), (x), or (xi) of 7 8 this subdivision, or a crime of violence; acquired with proceeds gained from the 9 (D) 10 commission of a felony listed in Paragraph (A) or (B) of this subdivision, a misdemeanor listed in Paragraph (B)(vii), (ix), (x), 11 12 or (xi) of this subdivision, or a crime of violence; (E) used to facilitate or intended to be used to 13 14 facilitate the commission of a felony under Section 15.031 or 15 43.25, Penal Code; or (F) used to facilitate or intended to be used to 16 17 facilitate the commission of a felony under Section 20A.02 or Chapter 43, Penal Code. 18 SECTION 2. Section 365.012(i), Health and Safety Code, is 19 amended to read as follows: 20 21 (i) On conviction for <u>any misdemeanor</u> [an offense] under this section, the court shall provide to the defendant written 22 notice that a subsequent conviction for an offense under this 23 24 section may result in the forfeiture under Chapter 59, Code of Criminal Procedure, of the vehicle used by the defendant in 25 26 committing the offense. 27 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only

to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
before that date.
