A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the creation and duties of the Global Climate Change
- 3 Commission.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. STATEMENT OF POLICY. (a) There is broad
- 6 agreement between nations, across states, and among scientists that
- 7 increasing emissions of carbon dioxide, methane, and other
- 8 greenhouse gases released into the earth's atmosphere are affecting
- 9 the earth's climate.
- 10 (b) There is further consensus that global climate change,
- 11 national security, and energy dependence are a related set of
- 12 global challenges.
- 13 (c) The potential adverse effects of global climate change
- 14 in the coming decades include extreme weather events, drought, a
- 15 decline in air quality, rising sea levels and global temperatures,
- 16 and exacerbation of challenges such as infectious disease and
- 17 terrorism.
- 18 (d) The state of the world's climate in the future largely
- 19 depends on how global leaders react to global climate change now.
- (e) Many states and countries have reached across borders to
- 21 collaborate and develop policies to reduce greenhouse gas
- 22 emissions, spur private investment in clean energy, and enhance
- 23 energy security.
- 24 (f) By not taking aggressive action to reduce greenhouse gas

- 1 emissions, the state is missing out on an opportunity to become a
- 2 global leader in protecting against global climate change and risks
- 3 exposing the state's economy and its citizens to unmitigated
- 4 consequences.
- 5 (g) Global warming will have deleterious effects on the
- 6 state's labor productivity, infrastructure, and industries,
- 7 including agriculture, water, energy, forestry, and tourism.
- 8 (h) Actions to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, such as
- 9 energy conservation and development of renewable energy sources,
- 10 may have multiple benefits, including economic development, job
- 11 creation, cost savings, and improved air quality in and beyond the
- 12 boundaries of this state.
- 13 (i) Recognizing the potential threat to the environment,
- 14 economy, and national security, it is the intent of the Texas
- 15 Legislature to create a global climate change commission committed
- 16 to working toward mitigating the impacts of global climate change
- 17 nationally and internationally.
- 18 SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 19 (1) "Commission" means the Global Climate Change
- 20 Commission.
- 21 (2) "Greenhouse gas" has the meaning assigned by
- 22 Section 403.028, Government Code.
- 23 (3) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
- 24 assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code.
- 25 SECTION 3. COMMISSION CREATED; COMPOSITION. (a) The Global
- 26 Climate Change Commission is created.
- 27 (b) The commission is composed of:

- 1 (J) a representative of the fossil fuel industry;
- 2 (K) a representative from the Health and Human
- 3 Services Commission; and
- 4 (L) four representatives of the public.
- 5 SECTION 4. PRESIDING OFFICER; MEETINGS; COMPENSATION. (a)
- 6 The commission shall elect one of its members to serve as presiding
- 7 officer.
- 8 (b) The commission shall meet at least quarterly and at the
- 9 call of the presiding officer.
- 10 (c) A commission member is not entitled to receive
- 11 compensation for service on the commission but is entitled to
- 12 reimbursement for travel expenses incurred by the member while
- 13 conducting the business of the commission, as provided by the
- 14 General Appropriations Act.
- 15 SECTION 5. DUTIES OF COMMISSION. (a) Not later than
- 16 September 1, 2016, the commission shall prepare and deliver a
- 17 comprehensive inventory and forecast of greenhouse gas emissions in
- 18 this state from 2000 to 2030 to the governor, lieutenant governor,
- 19 speaker of the house of representatives, state energy conservation
- 20 office, and Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.
- 21 (b) The commission shall:
- 22 (1) design a multiregional, multistate, and
- 23 multilateral approach to:
- 24 (A) reduce greenhouse gas emissions;
- 25 (B) reduce energy demands;
- 26 (C) protect public health; and
- (D) increase public and private investment in

- 1 clean energy, energy efficiency, and sustainable infrastructure;
- 2 (2) assess the impact of global climate change on
- 3 important matters of national security; and
- 4 (3) develop and recommend a portfolio of feasible and
- 5 affordable policy options to reduce this state's vulnerability to
- 6 the predictable effects of global climate change.
- 7 (c) The commission shall submit a preliminary written
- 8 report of its activities and progress under Subsection (b) of this
- 9 section to the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house
- 10 of representatives, state energy conservation office, and Texas
- 11 Commission on Environmental Quality not later than September 1,
- 12 2016. The report must include a comprehensive and coordinated plan
- 13 for adapting the state's economy, infrastructure, security
- 14 policies, and public health policies to:
- 15 (1) address the consequences of global climate change;
- 16 and
- 17 (2) ensure continued economic global competitiveness.
- 18 (d) The commission shall submit a final written report of
- 19 its activities and recommendations under Subsection (b) of this
- 20 section on or before January 1, 2017, to the legislature, including
- 21 the state affairs committee of each house of the legislature.
- 22 SECTION 6. APPOINTMENTS. As soon as possible after this Act
- 23 takes effect:
- 24 (1) the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the
- 25 house of representatives, and members of the legislature described
- 26 by Section 3 of this Act shall make the appointments required by
- 27 that section; and

- 1 (2) the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of
- 2 the house of representatives or their designees shall meet to
- apportion the appointments under Section 3(b)(6) of this Act.
- 4 SECTION 7. EXPIRATION. This Act expires and the commission
- 5 is abolished effective March 1, 2017.
- 6 SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 7 1, 2015.
