A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to contributions to, benefits from, and the administration
- 3 of systems and programs administered by the Teacher Retirement
- 4 System of Texas.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 822.201(b), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (b) "Salary and wages" as used in Subsection (a) means:
- 9 (1) normal periodic payments of money for service the
- 10 right to which accrues on a regular basis in proportion to the
- 11 service performed;
- 12 (2) amounts by which the member's salary is reduced
- 13 under a salary reduction agreement authorized by Chapter 610;
- 14 (3) amounts that would otherwise qualify as salary and
- 15 wages under Subdivision (1) but are not received directly by the
- 16 member pursuant to a good faith, voluntary written salary reduction
- 17 agreement in order to finance payments to a deferred compensation
- 18 or tax sheltered annuity program specifically authorized by state
- 19 law or to finance benefit options under a cafeteria plan qualifying
- 20 under Section 125 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, if:
- 21 (A) the program or benefit options are made
- 22 available to all employees of the employer; and
- 23 (B) the benefit options in the cafeteria plan are
- 24 limited to one or more options that provide deferred compensation,

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- 1 group health and disability insurance, group term life insurance,
- 2 dependent care assistance programs, or group legal services plans;
- 3 (4) performance pay awarded to an employee by a school
- 4 district as part of a total compensation plan approved by the board
- 5 of trustees of the district and meeting the requirements of
- 6 Subsection (e);
- 7 (5) the benefit replacement pay a person earns under
- 8 Subchapter H, Chapter 659, except as provided by Subsection (c);
- 9 (6) stipends paid to teachers in accordance with
- 10 Section 21.410, 21.411, 21.412, or 21.413, Education Code;
- 11 (7) amounts by which the member's salary is reduced or
- 12 that are deducted from the member's salary as authorized by
- 13 Subchapter J, Chapter 659;
- 14 (8) a merit salary increase made under Section 51.962,
- 15 Education Code;
- 16 (9) amounts received under the relevant parts of the
- 17 educator excellence awards program under Subchapter O, Chapter 21,
- 18 Education Code, or a mentoring program under Section 21.458,
- 19 Education Code, that authorize compensation for service;
- 20 (10) salary amounts designated as health care
- 21 supplementation by an employee under Subchapter D, Chapter 22,
- 22 Education Code; and
- 23 (11) to the extent required by Sections 3401(h) and
- 24 414(u)(12) $[\frac{414(u)(2)}{2}]$, Internal Revenue Code of 1986,
- 25 differential wage payments received by an individual from an
- 26 employer on or after January 1, 2009, while the individual is
- 27 performing qualified military service as defined by Section 414(u),

- 1 Internal Revenue Code of 1986.
- 2 SECTION 2. Section 823.006, Government Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 823.006. LIMITS ON ANNUAL CONTRIBUTIONS FOR PURCHASE
- 5 OF SERVICE CREDIT. Notwithstanding any other provision of this
- 6 subtitle, the retirement system \underline{shall} [\underline{may}] limit the purchase of
- 7 service credit to the extent required by applicable limits on the
- 8 amount of annual contributions a participant may make to a
- 9 qualified plan under Sections 401(a) and 415(c), Internal Revenue
- 10 Code of 1986.
- SECTION 3. Section 824.202(f), Government Code, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 (f) Except as provided by Chapter 803 or 805, a member is not
- 14 eligible to receive service retirement benefits from the retirement
- 15 system unless the member has at least five years of service credit
- 16 in the retirement system for actual service in public schools or
- 17 other service the board by rule may prescribe.
- SECTION 4. Sections 825.002(a), (d), and (e), Government
- 19 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 20 (a) The governor shall appoint, with the advice and consent
- 21 of the senate and as provided by this section, <u>nine</u> [seven] members
- 22 of the board of trustees.
- 23 (d) The governor shall appoint two members [one member] of
- 24 the board from a slate of three former members of the retirement
- 25 system who have retired and are receiving benefits from the
- 26 retirement system and who have been nominated in accordance with
- 27 Subsections (f) and (g) by the persons who have retired and are

- 1 receiving benefits from the retirement system.
- 2 (e) The governor shall appoint two members [one member] of
- 3 the board from a slate of three persons who have been nominated in
- 4 accordance with Subsection (f) by the following groups
- 5 collectively:
- 6 (1) members of the retirement system whose most recent
- 7 credited service was performed for an institution of higher
- 8 education;
- 9 (2) members of the retirement system whose most recent
- 10 credited service was performed for a public school district,
- 11 charter school, or regional education service center; and
- 12 (3) persons who have retired and are receiving
- 13 benefits from the retirement system.
- 14 SECTION 5. Section 825.408(a), Government Code, is amended
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 (a) An employer that fails to remit, before the 10th
- 17 [seventh] day after the last day of a month, all member and employer
- 18 deposits and documentation of the deposits required by this
- 19 subchapter to be remitted by the employer for the month shall pay to
- 20 the retirement system, in addition to the deposits, interest on the
- 21 unpaid or undocumented amounts at an annual rate compounded
- 22 monthly. The rate of interest is the rate established under
- 23 Section 825.313(b)(1), plus two percent. Interest required under
- 24 this section is creditable to the interest account. On request,
- 25 the retirement system may grant a waiver of the deadline imposed by
- 26 this subsection based on an employer's financial or technological
- 27 resources.

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- 1 SECTION 6. Section 1579.255(a), Insurance Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (a) A participating entity that does not remit to the
- 4 trustee all contributions required by this subchapter before the
- 5 10th [seventh] day after the last day of the month shall pay to the
- 6 Texas school employees uniform group coverage trust fund:
- 7 (1) the contributions; and
- 8 (2) interest on the unpaid amounts at the annual rate
- 9 of six percent compounded monthly.
- SECTION 7. Section 825.002, Government Code, as amended by
- 11 this Act, applies only to an election of a member of the board of
- 12 trustees of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas that occurs on or
- 13 after the effective date of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 8. The board of trustees of the Teacher Retirement
- 15 System of Texas shall study the benefits, funding, and
- 16 administration of the retirement system and adopt findings and
- 17 recommendations that will improve the administration and
- 18 performance of the retirement system. Not later than December 1,
- 19 2016, the board shall report the board's findings and
- 20 recommendations to the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of
- 21 the house of representatives, and standing committees of the house
- 22 of representatives and senate that have primary jurisdiction over
- 23 state pension systems.
- SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
