3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, is amended
5	by adding Subchapter W to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER W. INFORMATION REGARDING DOWN SYNDROME
7	Sec. 161.651. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
8	(1) "Down syndrome" means a chromosomal condition
9	caused by the presence of an extra whole or partial copy of
10	chromosome 21.
11	(2) "Health care provider" has the meaning assigned by
12	Section 34.001 and includes a genetic counselor.
13	Sec. 161.652. INFORMATION REGARDING DOWN SYNDROME. (a) A
14	health care provider that administers or causes to be administered
15	a test for Down syndrome shall, upon receiving a test result that is
16	positive for Down syndrome, provide the expectant or new parent
17	with educational information made available by the department under
18	<pre>subsection(c).</pre>
19	(b) Delivery of information prepared by the department in
20	accordance with subsection (c) at the time genetic results or
21	diagnostic conclusions are provided shall constitute compliance
22	with this section.
23	(c) The department shall make the following information
24	available on the department's publicly accessible Internet

- 2 (1) information addressing physical, developmental,
- 3 educational, and psychosocial outcomes, life expectancy, clinical
- 4 course, and intellectual and functional development for
- 5 individuals with Down syndrome;
- 6 (2) information regarding available treatment options
- 7 for individuals with Down syndrome;
- 8 (3) contact information for national and local Down
- 9 syndrome education and support programs, including organizations
- 10 <u>in Houston, Dallas, San Antonio, and Austin, as well as other local</u>
- 11 Down syndrome organizations in Texas;
- 12 (4) information hotlines and websites, resource
- 13 centers, and clearinghouses specific to Down syndrome; and
- 14 (4) any other information the department considers
- 15 necessary.
- 16 (d) The written information described by Subsection (c)
- 17 must be current, evidence-based information that has been reviewed
- 18 by medical experts and national Down syndrome organizations.
- 19 (e) The information described by Subsection (c) must be
- 20 published in English and Spanish.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
