## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to programs in public schools designed to facilitate
3	planning and saving for higher education and facilitate personal
4	financial literacy instruction.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 28.0024 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 28.0024. SCHOOL-BASED SAVINGS PROGRAM. (a) A school
9	district or open-enrollment charter school may establish a
10	school-based savings program to facilitate increased awareness of
11	the importance of saving for higher education and facilitate
12	personal financial literacy instruction. A district or school may
13	offer the program in conjunction with a personal financial literacy
14	course under Section 28.0021.
15	(b) A school-based savings program may, through
16	partnerships with financial institutions, as defined by Section
17	201.101, Finance Code, promote:
18	(1) general savings, by offering savings accounts or
19	certificates of deposit through partner financial institutions; or
20	(2) savings dedicated for higher education, by
21	offering accounts through partner financial institutions that are
22	dedicated exclusively to paying expenses associated with higher
23	education, including:
24	(A) an account authorized under Section 529,

- 5 <u>(D) a savings account; and</u>
- 6 <u>(E) a Roth IRA.</u>
- (c) A district or school establishing a program under this section shall seek to establish partnerships with financial institutions, public sector partners, private businesses,
- 10 nonprofit organizations, or philanthropic organizations in the
- 11 community. A partnership between a district or school and:
- 12 (1) a financial institution may allow a student in the
- 13 program or another adult in the student's family to have an
- opportunity to establish an account described under Subsection (b);
- 15 and
- 16 (2) a financial institution, public sector partner,
- 17 private business, or nonprofit or philanthropic organization may
- 18 provide:
- 19 (A) a structure for the management of the
- 20 program; and
- 21 (B) incentives that encourage contribution to a
- 22 <u>school-based account under Subsection (b), including incentives</u>
- 23 that provide matching funds or seed funding.
- SECTION 2. Section 56.007, Education Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- Sec. 56.007. EXCLUSION OF ASSETS IN PREPAID TUITION
- 27 PROGRAMS AND HIGHER EDUCATION SAVINGS PLANS. Notwithstanding any

- 1 other law, the right of a person to assets held in or the right to
- 2 receive payments or benefits under any fund, school-based account,
- 3 or plan established under <u>Section 28.0024(b)(2) up to the amount of</u>
- 4 the highest cost of undergraduate resident tuition and required
- 5 fees for a 30-semester hour academic year at a Texas public college
- 6 or university or Subchapter G, H, or I, Chapter 54, including an
- 7 interest in a savings trust account, prepaid tuition account, or
- 8 related matching account, may not be considered an asset of the
- 9 person, or otherwise included in the person's household income or
- 10 other financial resources, for purposes of determining the person's
- 11 eligibility for a TEXAS grant or any other state-funded student
- 12 financial assistance.
- 13 SECTION 3. Section 31.0039, Human Resources Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 31.0039. EXCLUSION OF ASSETS IN PREPAID TUITION
- 16 PROGRAMS AND HIGHER EDUCATION SAVINGS PLANS. For purposes of
- 17 determining the amount of financial assistance granted to an
- 18 individual under this chapter for the support of dependent children
- 19 or determining whether the family meets household income and
- 20 resource requirements for financial assistance under this chapter,
- 21 the department may not consider the right to assets held in or the
- 22 right to receive payments or benefits under:
- 23 (1) any fund, <u>school-based account</u>, or plan
- 24 established under <u>Section 28.0024(b)(2)</u>, <u>Education Code</u>, up to the
- 25 amount of the highest cost of undergraduate resident tuition and
- 26 required fees for a 30-semester hour academic year at a Texas public
- 27 college or university. or Subchapter G, H, or I, Chapter 54,

- 1 Education Code, including an interest in a savings trust account,
- 2 prepaid tuition contract, or related matching account; or
- 3 (2) any qualified tuition program of any state that
- 4 meets the requirements of Section 529, Internal Revenue Code of
- 5 1986.
- 6 SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 33, Human Resources Code,
- 7 is amended by adding Section 33.0291 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 33.0291. EXCLUSION OF SCHOOL-BASED ACCOUNTS. For
- 9 purposes of determining whether a person meets family income and
- 10 resource requirements for eligibility for the supplemental
- 11 nutrition assistance program, the commission may not consider as
- 12 income or resources a right to assets held in or a right to receive
- 13 payments or benefits under a school-based account established under
- 14 Section 28.0024(b)(2), Education Code up to the amount of the
- 15 highest cost of undergraduate resident tuition and required fees
- 16 for a 30-semester hour academic year at a Texas public college or
- 17 university.
- 18 SECTION 5. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 19 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 20 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 21 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 22 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 23 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 24 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

1 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
