## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 6, Article I, Texas Constitution, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 6. (a) All men have a natural and indefeasible right
- 7 to worship Almighty God according to the dictates of their own
- 8 consciences. No man shall be compelled to attend, erect or support
- 9 any place of worship, or to maintain any ministry against his
- 10 consent. No human authority ought, in any case whatever, to control
- 11 or interfere with the rights of conscience in matters of religion,
- 12 and no preference shall ever be given by law to any religious
- 13 society or mode of worship.
- 14 (b) The state or a county, municipality, or other political
- 15 subdivision of the state, including a department, agency, or
- 16 instrumentality of the state or of a political subdivision of the
- 17 state, may not burden in any way a person's free exercise of
- 18 religion unless the burden is:
- (1) necessary to further a compelling governmental

- 21 (2) the least restrictive means of furthering that

- (c) A homeowners' association may not burden in any way a
- 24 person's free exercise of religion unless the burden is:
