4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 55, Occupations Code, as
6	amended by Chapters 66 (S.B. 162) and 348 (H.B. 2254), Acts of the
7	83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, is reenacted to read as
8	follows:
9	CHAPTER 55. LICENSING OF MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS, MILITARY
10	VETERANS, AND MILITARY SPOUSES
11	SECTION 2. Section 55.001, Occupations Code, is amended to
12	read as follows:
13	Sec. 55.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
14	(1) <u>"Active duty" means current full-time military</u>
15	service in the armed forces of the United States or active duty
16	military service as a member of the Texas military forces, as
17	defined by Section 437.001, Government Code, or similar military
18	service of another state.
19	(2) "Armed forces of the United States" means the
20	army, navy, air force, coast guard, or marine corps of the United
21	States or a reserve unit of one of those branches of the armed
22	forces.
23	(3) "License" means a license, certificate,
24	registration, permit, or other form of authorization required by

law or a state agency rule that must be obtained by an individual to
 engage in a particular business.

3 <u>(4)</u> [(1-a)] "Military service member" means a person 4 who is <u>on active duty</u> [currently serving in the armed forces of the 5 <u>United States, in a reserve component of the armed forces of the</u> 6 <u>United States, including the National Guard, or in the state</u> 7 <u>military service of any state</u>].

8 <u>(5)</u> [(1-b)] "Military spouse" means a person who is 9 married to a military service member [who is currently on active 10 duty].

11 (6) [(1-c)] "Military veteran" means a person who has 12 served <u>on active duty and who was discharged or released from active</u> 13 <u>duty</u> [in the army, navy, air force, marine corps, or coast guard of 14 the United States, or in an auxiliary service of one of those 15 <u>branches of the armed forces</u>].

16 <u>(7)</u> [(2)] "State agency" means a department, board, 17 bureau, commission, committee, division, office, council, or 18 agency of the state.

SECTION 3. Section 55.002, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 55.002. EXEMPTION FROM PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO RENEW LICENSE. A state agency that issues a license shall adopt rules to exempt an individual who holds a license issued by the agency from any increased fee or other penalty imposed by the agency for failing to renew the license in a timely manner if the individual establishes to the satisfaction of the agency that the individual failed to renew the license in a timely manner because the

individual was serving as a military service member [on active duty
 in the United States armed forces serving outside this state].

3 SECTION 4. Section 55.003, Occupations Code, is amended to 4 read as follows:

5 Sec. 55.003. EXTENSION OF LICENSE RENEWAL [CERTAIN] DEADLINES FOR [ACTIVE DUTY] MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS [PERSONNEL]. 6 7 A military service member [person] who holds a license[, is a member of the state military forces or a reserve component of the armed 8 9 forces of the United States, and is ordered to active duty by proper authority] is entitled to two years of [an] additional [amount of] 10 11 time[, equal to the total number of years or parts of years that the person serves on active duty,] to complete: 12

13

(1) any continuing education requirements; and

14 (2) any other requirement related to the renewal of
15 the military service member's [person's] license.

16 SECTION 5. Section 55.004, Occupations Code, is amended to 17 read as follows:

Sec. 55.004. ALTERNATIVE <u>LICENSING</u> [LICENSE PROCEDURE] FOR 18 MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS, MILITARY VETERANS, AND MILITARY SPOUSES 19 A state agency that issues a license shall adopt 20 [SPOUSE]. (a) rules for the issuance of the license to an applicant who is a 21 military service member, military veteran, or military spouse [the 22 spouse of a person serving on active duty as a member of the armed 23 forces of the United States] and: 24

(1) holds a current license issued by another
 <u>jurisdiction</u> [state] that has licensing requirements that are
 substantially equivalent to the requirements for the license <u>in</u>

1 this state; or

2 (2) within the five years preceding the application
3 date held the license in this state [that expired while the
4 applicant lived in another state for at least six months].

5 (b) [Rules adopted under this section must include 6 provisions to allow alternative demonstrations of competency to 7 meet the requirements for obtaining the license.

8 [(c)] The executive director of a state agency may <u>waive any</u> 9 prerequisite to obtaining a license for an applicant described by 10 <u>Subsection (a) after reviewing the applicant's credentials</u> [issue a 11 license by endorsement in the same manner as the Texas Commission of 12 Licensing and Regulation under Section 51.404 to an applicant 13 described by Subsection (a)].

14 (c) In addition to the rules adopted under Subsection (a), a
15 state agency that issues a license may adopt rules that would
16 establish alternate methods for a military service member, military
17 veteran, or military spouse to demonstrate competency to meet the
18 requirements for obtaining the license.

SECTION 6. The heading to Section 55.005, Occupations Code, as added by Chapter 66 (S.B. 162), Acts of the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, is amended to read as follows:

22 Sec. 55.005. EXPEDITED LICENSE PROCEDURE FOR <u>MILITARY</u> 23 <u>SERVICE MEMBERS, MILITARY VETERANS, AND</u> MILITARY SPOUSES.

SECTION 7. Section 55.005(a), Occupations Code, as added by Chapter 66 (S.B. 162), Acts of the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, is amended to read as follows:

27 (a) A state agency that issues a license shall, as soon as

1 practicable after a military service member, military veteran, or 2 military spouse files an application for a license:

(1) process the application; and

3

4 (2) issue <u>the</u> [a] license to <u>an</u> [a qualified military
5 spouse] applicant who <u>qualifies for the license under Section</u>
6 <u>55.004</u> [holds a current license issued by another jurisdiction that
7 has licensing requirements that are substantially equivalent to the
8 licensing requirements in this state].

9 SECTION 8. Section 55.005, Occupations Code, as added by 10 Chapter 348 (H.B. 2254), Acts of the 83rd Legislature, Regular 11 Session, 2013, is redesignated as Section 55.008, Occupations Code, 12 and amended to read as follows:

Sec. 55.008 [55.005]. APPRENTICESHIP 13 REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICANT WITH MILITARY EXPERIENCE. 14 (a) Notwithstanding any other law, if an apprenticeship is required for a [an occupational] 15 16 license issued by a state agency, the state agency shall credit verified military service, training, or education that is relevant 17 to the occupation toward the apprenticeship requirements for the 18 license. 19

20 (b) The state agency shall adopt rules necessary to 21 implement this section.

SECTION 9. The heading to Section 55.006, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

24 Sec. 55.006. RENEWAL OF EXPEDITED LICENSE ISSUED TO 25 <u>MILITARY SERVICE MEMBER, MILITARY VETERAN, OR</u> MILITARY SPOUSE.

26 SECTION 10. Chapter 55, Occupations Code, is amended by 27 adding Section 55.009 to read as follows:

<u>Sec. 55.009. NOTICE OF CHAPTER PROVISIONS. A state agency</u>
 <u>that issues a license shall prominently post a notice on the home</u>
 <u>page of the agency's Internet website describing the provisions of</u>
 <u>this chapter that are available to military service members,</u>
 military veterans, and military spouses.

6 SECTION 11. The changes in law made by this Act apply only 7 to an application for an occupational license or renewal of an 8 occupational license filed on or after January 1, 2016. An 9 application for a license or for license renewal filed before 10 January 1, 2016, is governed by the law in effect immediately before 11 the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect 12 for that purpose.

13 SECTION 12. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails 14 over another Act of the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, 15 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 16 codes.

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SECTION 13. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
