## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to protection of critical infrastructure from electromagnetic, geomagnetic, terrorist, and cyber-attack threats. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 418, Government Code, is amended by 5 adding Subchapter I to read as follows: 6 7 SUBCHAPTER I. ELECTROMAGNETIC THREAT PREPAREDNESS Sec. 418.201. (a) A technological hazards unit of the 8 9 division shall: 10 (1) implement a program to develop technical expertise in the protection of the electric transmission and distribution 11 system against electromagnetic, geomagnetic, and cyber-attack 12 13 threats; 14 (2) identify and develop technical and electronic resources to assist the unit in the unit's functions; 15 16 (3) implement a program to educate owners and operators of critical infrastructure and vital utility facilities 17 and emergency responders about electromagnetic, geomagnetic, and 18 cyber-attack threats; 19 20 (4) determine critical infrastructure and vital utility facilities that are at risk from electromagnetic, 21 22 geomagnetic, and cyber-attack threats; 23 (5) evaluate emergency planning and response technologies related to electromagnetic, geomagnetic, and 24

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## 1 cyber-attack threats; 2 (6) evaluate technologies available to improve the 3 resiliency of critical infrastructure and vital utility facilities against electromagnetic, geomagnetic, or cyber-attack threats; 4 5 (7) evaluate the capabilities of critical infrastructure and vital utility facilities to recover from 6 7 electromagnetic, geomagnetic, or cyber-attack threats; and (8) develop a comprehensive plan to protect the 8 critical infrastructure and vital utility facilities of this state 9 10 against electromagnetic, geomagnetic, terrorist, and cyber-attack threats. 11 12 (b) The division shall implement the comprehensive plan to protect the critical infrastructure and vital utility facilities of 13 this state against electromagnetic, geomagnetic, terrorist, and 14 cyber-attack threats. 15 (c) The governor may instruct an agency to take actions as 16 are necessary to implement the comprehensive plan. 17 (d) The governor shall <u>develop a cost recovery mechanism for</u> 18 19 utilities that incur costs for measures taken to protect the critical infrastructure of this state against, and prepare the 20 infrastructure for, electromagnetic, geomagnetic, terrorist, and 21 22 cyber-attack threats. 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 25 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
