A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment limiting to two the number of
- 2 consecutive terms for which a person may be elected or appointed to
- 3 hold certain state offices.
- 4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Article IV, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 6 adding Section 2a to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 2a. (a) A person who has been elected or appointed to
- 8 serve two consecutive terms in an office listed in Section 1 of this
- 9 article or any other statewide elective office, other than a
- 10 statewide judicial office, is not eligible for election or
- 11 appointment to serve a third consecutive term. This provision does
- 12 <u>not limit a person's eligibility for election or appointment to</u>
- 13 <u>serve nonconsecutive terms.</u>
- 14 (b) Nothing in this section prohibits a person from
- 15 continuing to serve in an office covered by this section after the
- 16 end of a term as a holdover under Section 17, Article XVI, of this
- 17 constitution until a successor is qualified.
- 18 <u>(c) The term of a person appointed to serve for the</u>
- 19 remainder of a term to fill a vacancy in an office to which
- 20 Subsection (a) of this section applies is not counted in
- 21 determining whether the person is eligible to serve under that
- 22 subsection.
- 23 SECTION 2. The following temporary provision is added to
- 24 the Texas Constitution:

- 1 TEMPORARY PROVISION. (a) This temporary provision applies
- 2 to the constitutional amendment proposed by the 84th Legislature,
- 3 Regular Session, 2015, limiting to two the number of consecutive
- 4 terms for which a person may be elected or appointed to hold certain
- 5 state offices.
- 6 (b) A term of office that begins before January 1, 2016, is
- 7 not counted in determining whether a person is eligible to serve
- 8 under Section 2a, Article IV, of this constitution.
- 9 (c) This temporary provision expires February 1, 2033.
- 10 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 11 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 3, 2015.
- 12 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 13 proposition: "The constitutional amendment limiting to two the
- 14 number of consecutive terms for which a person may be elected or
- 15 appointed to hold the office of governor, lieutenant governor,
- 16 secretary of state, comptroller of public accounts, commissioner of
- 17 the General Land Office, attorney general, commissioner of
- 18 agriculture, or railroad commissioner."
