## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of a commission to recommend improvements
3	to the public school finance system.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 42, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter L to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER L. TEXAS COMMISSION ON PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCE
8	Sec. 42.601. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "commission"
9	means the Texas Commission on Public School Finance.
10	Sec. 42.602. TEXAS COMMISSION ON PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCE.
11	(a) The Texas Commission on Public School Finance is established
12	to develop and make recommendations for improvements to the current
13	public school finance system or for new methods of financing public
14	schools.
15	(b) The commission is composed of 13 members, consisting of
16	the following:
17	(1) four members appointed by the governor;
18	(2) four members appointed by the lieutenant governor;
19	(3) four members appointed by the speaker of the house
20	of representatives; and
21	(4) a member of the State Board of Education, as
22	designated by the chair of that board.
23	(c) The members appointed by the governor must have an

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interest in public education and must include at least one member of

- 1 the business community and at least one member of the civic
- 2 community.
- 3 (d) The appointments made by the lieutenant governor and the
- 4 speaker of the house of representatives must each consist of:
- 5 (1) three members of the applicable legislative
- 6 chamber; and
- 7 (2) an administrator in the public school system or an
- 8 elected member of the board of trustees of a school district.
- 9 Sec. 42.603. PRESIDING OFFICER. The governor shall
- 10 designate the presiding officer of the commission.
- 11 Sec. 42.604. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of
- 12 the commission is not entitled to compensation for service on the
- 13 commission but is entitled to reimbursement for actual and
- 14 necessary expenses incurred in performing commission duties.
- 15 Sec. 42.605. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT AND FUNDING.
- 16 (a) Staff members of the agency shall provide administrative
- 17 support for the commission.
- (b) Funding for the administrative and operational expenses
- 19 of the commission shall be provided by appropriation to the agency
- 20 for that purpose.
- Sec. 42.606. RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) The commission shall
- 22 develop recommendations under this subchapter to address issues
- 23 related to the public school finance system, including:
- 24 (1) the purpose of the public school finance system
- 25 and the relationship between state and local funding in that
- 26 system;
- 27 (2) the appropriate levels of local maintenance and

- 1 operations and interest and sinking fund tax effort necessary to
- 2 implement a public school finance system that complies with the
- 3 requirements under the Texas Constitution; and
- 4 (3) policy changes to the public school finance system
- 5 necessary to adjust for student demographics and the geographic
- 6 diversity in the state.
- 7 (b) The commission may establish one or more working groups
- 8 composed of not more than five members of the commission to study,
- 9 discuss, and address specific policy issues and recommendations to
- 10 refer to the commission for consideration.
- Sec. 42.607. REPORT. Not later than December 31, 2018, the
- 12 commission shall prepare and deliver a report to the governor and
- 13 the legislature that recommends statutory changes to improve the
- 14 public school finance system, including any adjustments to funding
- 15 to account for student demographics.
- 16 Sec. 42.608. PUBLIC MEETINGS AND PUBLIC INFORMATION.
- 17 (a) The commission may hold public meetings as needed to fulfill
- 18 its duties under this subchapter.
- 19 (b) The commission is subject to Chapters 551 and 552,
- 20 Government Code.
- Sec. 42.609. COMMISSION ABOLISHED; EXPIRATION OF
- 22 SUBCHAPTER. (a) The commission is abolished January 8, 2019.
- (b) This subchapter expires January 8, 2019.
- SECTION 2. Not later than the 30th day after the effective
- 25 date of this Act, the appropriate persons shall make the
- 26 appointments and designations required by Section 42.602,
- 27 Education Code, as added by this Act.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the legislative session.
