## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to non-medical exemptions from immunization requirements.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Sections 38.001(c) and (f), Education Code, are
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (c) Immunization is not required for a person's admission to
- 7 any elementary or secondary school if the person applying for
- 8 admission:
- 9 (1) submits to the admitting official:
- 10 (A) an affidavit or a certificate signed by a
- 11 physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine
- 12 in the United States, in which it is stated that, in the physician's
- 13 opinion, the immunization required poses a significant risk to the
- 14 health and well-being of the applicant or any member of the
- 15 applicant's family or household; or
- 16 (B) an affidavit signed by the applicant or, if a
- 17 minor, by the applicant's parent or guardian stating that the
- 18 applicant declines immunization for <u>non-medical</u> reasons [<del>of</del>
- 19 conscience, including a religious belief]; or
- 20 (2) is a member of the armed forces of the United
- 21 States and is on active duty.
- 22 (f) A person who has not received the immunizations required
- 23 by this section for non-medical reasons [of conscience, including
- 24 because of the person's religious beliefs, may be excluded from

- 1 school in times of emergency or epidemic declared by the
- 2 commissioner of <a href="state">state</a> [public] health <a href="services">services</a>.
- 3 SECTION 2. Sections 51.9192(d), (d-3), and (d-4), Education
- 4 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (d) A student to whom this section applies or a parent or
- 6 guardian of the student is not required to comply with Subsection
- 7 (c) if the student or a parent or guardian of the student submits to
- 8 the institution:
- 9 (1) an affidavit or a certificate signed by a
- 10 physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine
- 11 in the United States in which it is stated that, in the physician's
- 12 opinion, the vaccination required would be injurious to the health
- 13 and well-being of the student; or
- 14 (2) an affidavit signed by the student stating that
- 15 the student declines the vaccination for bacterial meningitis for
- 16 non-medical reasons [of conscience, including a religious belief,]
- 17 or confirmation that the student has completed the Internet-based
- 18 process described by Subsection (d-3) for declining the vaccination
- 19 on that basis, if applicable to the student.
- 20 (d-3) The Department of State Health Services shall develop
- 21 and implement a secure, Internet-based process to be used
- 22 exclusively at those public junior colleges that elect to use the
- 23 process to allow an entering student to apply online for an
- 24 exemption from the vaccination requirement under this section for
- 25 non-medical reasons [of conscience]. The online process portal
- 26 must be designed to ensure that duplicate exemption requests are
- 27 avoided to the greatest extent possible. The exemption form used by

- 1 a student to claim an exemption under the process must contain a
- 2 statement indicating that the student understands the benefits and
- 3 risks of the immunization and the benefits and risks of not
- 4 receiving the immunization.
- 5 (d-4) A public junior college may require an entering
- 6 student to use the Internet-based process under Subsection (d-3) as
- 7 the exclusive method to apply for an exemption from the vaccination
- 8 required under this section for  $\underline{\text{non-medical}}$  reasons [ $\underline{\text{of}}$
- 9 conscience].
- SECTION 3. Section 51.933(d), Education Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 (d) No form of immunization is required for a person's
- 13 admission to an institution of higher education if the person
- 14 applying for admission:
- 15 (1) submits to the admitting official:
- 16 (A) an affidavit or a certificate signed by a
- 17 physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine
- 18 within the United States in which it is stated that, in the
- 19 physician's opinion, the immunization required poses a significant
- 20 risk to the health and well-being of the applicant or any member of
- 21 the applicant's family or household; or
- 22 (B) an affidavit signed by the applicant or, if a
- 23 minor, by the applicant's parent or guardian stating that the
- 24 applicant declines immunization for non-medical reasons [of
- 25 conscience, including a religious belief]; or
- 26 (2) is a member of the armed forces of the United
- 27 States and is on active duty.

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 161.004(d), Health and Safety Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (d) A child is exempt from an immunization required by this
- 4 section if:
- 5 (1) a parent, managing conservator, or guardian states
- 6 that the immunization is being declined for non-medical reasons [of
- 7 conscience, including a religious belief]; or
- 8 (2) the immunization is medically contraindicated
- 9 based on the opinion of a physician licensed by any state in the
- 10 United States who has examined the child.
- 11 SECTION 5. Section 161.0041(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) A person claiming an exemption from a required
- 14 immunization based on non-medical reasons [of conscience,
- 15 including a religious belief, under Section 161.004 of this code,
- 16 Section 38.001, 51.9192, or 51.933, Education Code, or Section
- 17 42.043, Human Resources Code, must complete an affidavit on a form
- 18 provided by the department stating the reason for the exemption.
- 19 This subsection does not apply to a person claiming the exemption
- 20 using the Internet-based process under Section 51.9192(d-3),
- 21 Education Code.
- SECTION 6. Section 224.002(c), Health and Safety Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- 24 (c) The policy may include procedures for a covered
- 25 individual to be exempt from the required vaccines based on
- 26 non-medical reasons [of conscience, including a religious belief].
- 27 SECTION 7. Section 42.043(d), Human Resources Code, is

- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (d) No immunization may be required for admission to a
- 3 facility regulated under this chapter if a person applying for a
- 4 child's admission submits one of the following affidavits:
- 5 (1) an affidavit signed by a licensed physician
- 6 stating that the immunization poses a significant risk to the
- 7 health and well-being of the child or a member of the child's family
- 8 or household; or
- 9 (2) an affidavit signed by the child's parent or
- 10 guardian stating that the applicant declines immunization for
- 11 non-medical reasons [of conscience, including a religious belief].
- 12 SECTION 8. Section 42.04305(d), Human Resources Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (d) The policy shall include procedures for a facility
- 15 employee to be exempt from the required vaccines based on
- 16 non-medical reasons [of conscience, including a religious belief].
- 17 SECTION 9. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 18 of this Act, the Department of State Health Services shall modify
- 19 the existing affidavit form required by Section 161.0041, Health
- 20 and Safety Code, as amended by this Act.
- 21 SECTION 10. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 22 38.001, Education Code, relating to public school students apply
- 23 beginning with the 2017-2018 school year.
- 24 SECTION 11. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 25 51.9192 and 51.933, Education Code, apply only to entering students
- 26 enrolling in public institutions of higher education in this state
- 27 beginning with the 2017 fall semester.

- 1 SECTION 12. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 2 42.043, Human Resources Code, applies beginning September 1, 2017.
- 3 An affidavit submitted to a facility before the effective date of
- 4 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the affidavit
- 5 is submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 6 purpose.
- 7 SECTION 13. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
