A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to inclusion of instruction regarding interaction with
3	peace officers in the required curriculum for certain public school
4	students and in driver education courses and to civilian
5	interaction training for peace officers.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 28.012 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 28.012. INSTRUCTION ON INTERACTION WITH LAW

- 10 ENFORCEMENT. (a) In this section:
- (1) "Board" means the State Board of Education. 12 (2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on Law
- 13 Enforcement.

- 14 (b) The board and the commission shall enter into a
- memorandum of understanding that establishes each agency's 15
- respective responsibilities in developing instruction, including 16
- curriculum and instructional modules, on proper interaction with 17
- peace officers during traffic stops and other in-person encounters. 18
- The instruction must: 19
- (1) be base<u>d on recommendations made by the</u> 20
- Stakeholder Task Force on Police and Citizen Interactions convened 21
- 22 for that purpose; and
- 23 (2) include information regarding:
- 24 (A) the role of law enforcement and the duties

- 1 and responsibilities of peace officers;
- 2 (B) a person's rights concerning interactions
- 3 with peace officers;
- 4 (C) proper behavior for civilians and peace
- 5 officers during interactions;
- 6 (D) laws regarding questioning and detention by
- 7 peace officers, including any law requiring a person to present
- 8 proof of identity to a peace officer, and the consequences for a
- 9 person's or officer's failure to comply with those laws; and
- 10 (E) how and where to file a complaint against or a
- 11 compliment on behalf of a peace officer.
- 12 <u>(c)</u> The board and the commission may consult with any
- 13 interested party in developing the instruction under this section.
- 14 (d) Before finalizing any instruction under this section,
- 15 the board and the commission shall provide a reasonable period for
- 16 public comment.
- 17 <u>(e) A local district or open-enrollment charter school</u>
- 18 shall offer this instructional module on proper interaction with
- 19 peace of ficers during traffic stops and other in-person encounters.
- 20 A district or open-enrollment charter may offer this instructional
- 21 module as part of another required curriculum in Section
- 22 <u>28.002(a)(1).</u>
- SECTION 2. Section 28.025, Education Code, is amended by
- 24 adding Subsection (b-20) to read as follows:
- 25 (b-20) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to
- 26 include the instruction developed under Section 28.012 in the
- 27 required curriculum for students in grade levels 9 through 12.

- 1 SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 1001, Education Code, is
- 2 amended by adding Section 1001.109 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 1001.109. INFORMATION RELATING TO TRAFFIC STOPS.
- 4 (a) The commission by rule shall require that information relating
- 5 to law enforcement procedures for traffic stops be included in the
- 6 curriculum of each driver education course and driving safety
- 7 course. The curriculum must:
- 8 <u>(1) be based on recommendations made by the</u>
- 9 Stakeholder Task Force on Police and Citizen Interactions convened
- 10 for that purpose; and
- 11 <u>(2) include:</u>
- 12 (A) a demonstration of the proper actions to be
- 13 taken during a traffic stop; and
- 14 (B) information regarding:
- 15 (i) the role of law enforcement and the
- 16 <u>duties and responsibilities of peace officers;</u>
- 17 <u>(ii) a person's rights concerning</u>
- 18 interactions with peace officers;
- 19 (iii) proper behavior for civilians and
- 20 peace officers during interactions;
- 21 <u>(iv)</u> laws regarding questioning and
- 22 detention by peace officers, including any law requiring a person
- 23 to present proof of identity to a peace officer, and the
- 24 consequences for a person's or officer's failure to comply with
- 25 those laws; and
- (v) how and where to file a complaint
- 27 against or compliment on behalf of a peace officer.

- 1 (b) The commission shall develop instructional materials
- 2 and testing materials for the curriculum described by Subsection
- 3 (a).
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended
- 5 by adding Subsection (n) to read as follows:
- 6 (n) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the
- 7 commission shall require an officer to complete the civilian
- 8 interaction training program developed under Section 1701.268. An
- 9 officer shall complete the program not later than the second
- 10 anniversary of the date the officer is licensed under this chapter
- 11 unless the officer completes the program as part of the officer's
- 12 basic training course.
- SECTION 5. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Section 1701.268 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 1701.268. CIVILIAN INTERACTION TRAINING PROGRAM.
- 16 (a) In this section, "board" means the State Board of Education.
- 17 (b) The commission and the board shall enter into a
- 18 memorandum of understanding that establishes each agency's
- 19 respective responsibilities in developing a training program,
- 20 including training and testing materials, on proper interaction
- 21 with civilians during traffic stops and other in-person encounters.
- 22 The training program must:
- 23 (1) be based on recommendations made by the
- 24 Stakeholder Task Force on Police and Citizen Interactions convened
- 25 for that purpose; and
- 26 (2) include information regarding:
- 27 (A) the role of law enforcement and the duties

- 1 and responsibilities of peace officers;
- 2 (B) a person's rights concerning interactions
- 3 with peace officers;
- 4 (C) proper behavior for civilians and peace
- 5 officers during interactions;
- 6 (D) laws regarding questioning and detention by
- 7 peace officers, including any law requiring a person to present
- 8 proof of identity to a peace officer, and the consequences for a
- 9 person's or officer's failure to comply with those laws; and
- 10 (E) how and where to file a complaint against or
- 11 compliment on behalf of a peace officer.
- 12 <u>(c)</u> The commission and the board may consult with any
- 13 interested party in developing the training program under this
- 14 section.
- 15 (d) Before finalizing a training program under this
- 16 section, the commission and the board shall provide a reasonable
- 17 period for public comment.
- SECTION 6. (a) Not later than September 1, 2018, the State
- 19 Board of Education and the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement
- 20 shall develop:
- 21 (1) the instruction required under Section 28.012,
- 22 Education Code, as added by this Act; and
- 23 (2) the training program required under Section
- 24 1701.268, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 25 (b) Section 28.025(b-20), Education Code, as added by this
- 26 Act, applies beginning with the 2018-2019 school year.
- 27 (c) A peace officer or reserve law enforcement officer who

- 1 holds a license under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, issued on or
- 2 before January 1, 2018, shall complete a training program
- 3 established under Section 1701.268, Occupations Code, as added by
- 4 this Act, not later than January 1, 2020.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
