## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the award of attorney's fees and other costs in certain

3 proceedings involving a groundwater conservation district.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 36.066(g), Water Code, is amended to

6 read as follows:

7 (g) In a suit to which [If] the district is a party,

- [prevails in any suit other than a suit in which it voluntarily 8 intervenes, the district may seek and] the court may [shall] grant 9 reasonable and necessary[, in the interests of justice and as 10 provided by Subsection (h), in the same action, recovery for ] 11 12 attorney's fees, costs for expert witnesses, and other costs 13 incurred by the prevailing party [district] before the court as are equitable and just. The court may not award attorney's fees in an 14 15 amount that exceeds \$250,000. [The amount of the attorney's fees shall be fixed by the court. 16
- SECTION 2. Section 36.102(d), Water Code, is amended to 18 read as follows:
- (d) <u>In [If the district prevails in]</u> any suit to enforce <u>the</u>

  district's [its] rules, the [district may seek and the] court may

  [shall] grant reasonable and necessary [against any person, in the

  same action, recovery for] attorney's fees, costs for expert

  witnesses, and other costs incurred by the <u>prevailing party</u>

  [district] before the court as are equitable and just. The court

- 1 may not award attorney's fees in an amount that exceeds \$250,000.
- 2 [The amount of the attorney's fees shall be fixed by the court.]
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 36.066(h), Water Code, is repealed.
- 4 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 5 a proceeding commenced under Chapter 36, Water Code, on or after the
- 6 effective date of this Act. A proceeding commenced before the
- 7 effective date of this Act is governed by the law applicable to the
- 8 proceeding immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 9 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
