Relating to the appointment by the attorney general of a special prosecutor to prosecute certain offenses that are committed by certain peace officers and that result in serious bodily injury or death.

HB 968 Metcalf | et al.

Relating to the prosecution of the offense of possessing a weapon in certain prohibited places associated with schools or postsecondary educational institutions.

HB 981 Wray | et al.

Relating to the carrying of handguns by and an exemption from application of the Private Security Act of certain persons who provide security services on a volunteer basis at an established place of religious worship.

HB 1229 Blanco

Relating to prohibiting the transfer of a firearm to a person listed in the terrorist screening database maintained by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Relating to the indigent status of a person for the purposes of the driver responsibility program.

HB 2003 Swanson

Relating to the carrying of concealed or holstered handguns in a courthouse by certain court clerks licensed to carry a handgun.

HB 2034 Blanco

Relating to requiring a national instant criminal background check in connection with certain firearm sales; creating an offense.

HB 2044 Thompson, Senfronia

Relating to matters concerning peace officers, including racial profiling, use of force, equipment, and disciplinary procedures.

HB 2820 Pickett

Relating to establishing the Texas Peace Officers' Memorial Ceremony Committee to recognize and honor peace officers who were killed in the line of duty.

HB 3115 Simmons

Relating to the regulation of certain professions under the Private Security Act.

HB 3132 Hefner

Relating to financial assistance paid to the survivors of certain law enforcement officers and employees killed in the line of duty.

HB 3171 Parker

Relating to the amount of instruction time required for driver training.

HB 3340 Thompson, Senfronia

Relating to the provision of information regarding firearm safety and suicide prevention.

HB 3359 Cosper

Relating to providing information on the National Marrow Donor Program in driver's license offices and on driver's license and personal identification certificate applications.

HB 4003 Tinderholt

Relating to a central database containing information about defendants required to have an ignition interlock device installed on a vehicle and local law enforcement access to that database through a mobile data terminal.

HB 4121 White

Relating to the use of rapid DNA technology to identify, document and record all persons arrested for a felony or a class A misdemeanor.
