Interim Charge Seven: Consistent with the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's legislative directive to work with the Texas State Technical College System (TSTC) and other appropriate state agencies to develop a returned value funding model for TSTC, examine the benefits and challenges such an approach will have on technical education in Texas.

Interim Charge Eight: Monitor the implementation of legislation addressed by the Senate Committee on Higher Education, 82nd Legislature, Regular and Called Sessions, and make recommendations for any legislation needed to improve, enhance and/or complete implementation. Specifically, monitor the following:

- SB 5, relating to the administration and business affairs of public institutions of higher education;
- SB 28, relating to eligibility for a TEXAS grant and to administration of the TEXAS grant program;
- *HB 9, relating to student success-based funding;*
- *HB 33*, relating to measures to increase the affordability of textbooks used for courses at public or private institutions of higher education;
- SB 1107, Relating to the vaccination against bacterial meningitis of entering students at public and private or independent institutions of higher education;
- *HB 1000, relating to the distribution of money appropriated from the National Research University Fund.*
