5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 12, Education Code, is					
6	amended by adding Section 12.1015 to read as follows:					
7	Sec. 12.1015. AUTHORIZATION FOR GRANT OF CHARTERS FOR					
8	SCHOOLS PROVIDING ONLY PREKINDERGARTEN PROGRAMS. (a) The					
9	commissioner may grant under Section 12.101 a charter on the					
10	application of an eligible entity for an open-enrollment charter					
11	school intended to provide only prekindergarten programs.					
12	(b) A charter application for an open-enrollment charter					
13	school described by Subsection (a) may not be denied, and the					
14	charter of an open-enrollment charter school described by					
15	Subsection (a) may not be revoked or denied renewal, on the basis					
16	that the school does not provide instruction to students at any					
17	grade level at which students are assessed under Subchapter B,					
18	Chapter 39.					
19	(c) The limit on the number of charters for open-enrollment					
20	charter schools imposed by Section 12.101 does not apply to a					
21	charter granted under this section.					
22	(d) For purposes of the applicability of state and federal					
23	law, an open-enrollment charter school described by Subsection (a)					
24	is considered the same as any other school for which a charter is

2 <u>(e) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to</u> 3 <u>administer this section.</u>

4 SECTION 2. Section 12.118(b), Education Code, is amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (b) An evaluation under this section must include 7 consideration of the following items before implementing the 8 charter and after implementing the charter:

9 (1) <u>if applicable</u>, students' scores on assessment 10 instruments administered under Subchapter B, Chapter 39;

11 (2) student attendance;

12 (3) students' grades;

13 (4) incidents involving student discipline;

14 (5) socioeconomic data on students' families;

15 (6) parents' satisfaction with their children's 16 schools; and

17 (7) students' satisfaction with their schools.

18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
