3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:		
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 545, Transportation Code, is amended by		
5	adding Subchapter J to read as follows:		
6	SUBCHAPTER J. OPERATION OF AUTOMATED MOTOR VEHICLES		
7	Sec. 545.451. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:		
8	(1) "Automated driving system" means hardware and		
9	software that, when installed on a motor vehicle and engaged, are		
10	collectively capable of performing, without any intervention or		
11	supervision by a human operator:		
12	(A) all aspects of the entire dynamic driving		
13	task for the vehicle on a sustained basis; and		
14	(B) any fallback maneuvers necessary to respond		
15	to a failure of the system.		
16	(2) "Automated motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle on		
17	which an automated driving system is installed.		
18	(3) "Entire dynamic driving task" means the		
19	operational and tactical aspects of operating a vehicle. The term:		
20	(A) includes:		
21	(i) operational aspects, including		
22	steering, braking, accelerating, and monitoring the vehicle and the		
23	roadway; and		
24	(ii) tactical aspects, including		

- 1 responding to events, determining when to change lanes, turning,
- 2 using signals, and other related actions; and
- 3 (B) does not include strategic aspects,
- 4 including determining destinations or waypoints.
- 5 <u>(4) "Human operator" means a natural person in an</u>
- 6 <u>automated motor vehicle who controls the entire dynamic driving</u>
- 7 task.
- 8 (5) "Owner" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 9 502.001.
- 10 Sec. 545.452. SUBCHAPTER AND DEPARTMENT GOVERN
- 11 EXCLUSIVELY. (a) Unless otherwise provided by this subchapter,
- 12 the following are governed exclusively by this subchapter:
- 13 (1) automated motor vehicles, including any
- 14 commercial use or operation of automated motor vehicles; and
- 15 (2) automated driving systems.
- (b) A political subdivision of this state or a state agency
- 17 may not impose a franchise or other regulation related to the
- 18 operation of an automated motor vehicle or automated driving
- 19 system.
- 20 Sec. 545.453. OPERATOR OF AUTOMATED MOTOR VEHICLE.
- 21 (a) When an automated driving system installed on a motor vehicle
- 22 <u>is engaged:</u>
- 23 (1) the owner of the automated driving system is
- 24 considered the operator of the automated motor vehicle solely for
- 25 the purpose of assessing compliance with applicable traffic or
- 26 motor vehicle laws, regardless of whether the person is physically
- 27 present in the vehicle while the vehicle is operating; and

- 1 (2) the automated driving system is considered to be
- 2 licensed to operate the vehicle.
- 3 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a licensed human
- 4 operator is not required to operate a motor vehicle if an automated
- 5 driving system installed on the vehicle is engaged.
- 6 Sec. 545.454. AUTOMATED MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATION. (a) An
- 7 automated motor vehicle may operate in this state with the
- 8 <u>automated driving system engaged, regardless of whether a human</u>
- 9 operator is physically present in the vehicle.
- 10 (b) An automated motor vehicle may not operate on a highway
- 11 in this state with the automated driving system engaged unless the
- 12 vehicle is:
- 13 (1) capable of operating in compliance with applicable
- 14 traffic and motor vehicle laws of this state, subject to this
- 15 subchapter;
- 16 (2) equipped with a recording device, as defined by
- 17 Section 547.615(a), installed by the manufacturer of the automated
- 18 motor vehicle or automated driving system;
- 19 <u>(3) equipped with an automated driving system in</u>
- 20 compliance with applicable federal law and federal motor vehicle
- 21 safety standards;
- 22 (4) registered and titled in accordance with the laws
- 23 of this state; and
- (5) covered by motor vehicle liability coverage or
- 25 self-insurance in an amount equal to the amount of coverage that is
- 26 required under the laws of this state.
- Sec. 545.455. DUTIES FOLLOWING ACCIDENT INVOLVING

- 1 AUTOMATED MOTOR VEHICLE. In the event of an accident involving an
- 2 <u>automated motor vehicle</u>, the automated motor vehicle or any human
- 3 operator of the automated motor vehicle shall comply with Chapter
- 4 550.
- 5 Sec. 545.456. VEHICLE CLASSIFICATION. An owner as defined
- 6 by Section 502.001(31) may identify the vehicle to the department
- 7 as an automated motor vehicle or an automated driving system.
- 8 SECTION 2. (a) In this section, "a request to intervene"
- 9 means notification by a vehicle to the human operator that the
- 10 operator should promptly begin or resume performance of the entire
- 11 dynamic driving task.
- 12 (b) For purposes of Subchapter J, Chapter 545,
- 13 Transportation Code, as added by this Act, a motor vehicle equipped
- 14 with hardware and software capable of engaging in the entire
- 15 dynamic driving task with the expectation that a human operator
- 16 will respond appropriately to a request to intervene is subject to
- 17 Sections 545.452(b) and 545.454, Transportation Code, as added by
- 18 this Act.
- 19 (c) Nothing in Subchapter J, Chapter 545, Transportation
- 20 Code, as added by this Act, shall be construed to affect, alter, or
- 21 amend the right to operate a motor vehicle equipped with hardware
- 22 and software capable of performing the entire dynamic driving task
- 23 with the expectation that a human operator will respond
- 24 appropriately to a request to intervene.
- 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
