## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment to authorize the legislature
- 2 to exempt from ad valorem taxation a portion of the market value of
- 3 tangible personal property a person owns that is held or used for
- 4 the production of income.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 1(q), Article VIII, Texas Constitution,
- 7 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (g) The Legislature by general law may exempt from ad
- 9 valorem taxation \$125,000 of the market value of tangible personal
- 10 property that is held or used for the production of income [and has
- 11 a taxable value of less than the minimum amount sufficient to
- 12 recover the costs of the administration of the taxes on the
- 13 property, as determined by or under the general law granting the
- 14 exemption].
- 15 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 16 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2025.
- 17 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 18 proposition: "The constitutional amendment to authorize the
- 19 legislature to exempt from ad valorem taxation a portion of the
- 20 market value of tangible personal property a person owns that is
- 21 held or used for the production of income."
