A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1-21 1-22 AN ACT

1-23 relating to prohibiting the adoption or use of national sex 1-24 education standards in public schools.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

28.002(b-1), SECTION 1. Sections (b-2), and Education Code, are amended to read as follows:

(b-1)In this section:

"Common[, "common] core state standards" means the (1)national curriculum standards developed by the Common Core State Standards Initiative.

(2) "National sex education standards" means national for instruction in human sexuality or sexually transmitted diseases, including standards developed by the Future of Sex Education Initiative.
(b-2) The State Board of Education may not adopt common core

state standards or national sex education standards to comply with a duty imposed under this chapter.

(b-4) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, a school district or open-enrollment charter school may not be required to offer any aspect of a common core state standards curriculum or any aspect of the national sex education standards.

Section 28.004(e), Education Code, is amended to SECTION 2. read as follows:

(e) Any course materials and instruction relating to human sexuality, sexually transmitted diseases, or human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome shall be selected by the board of trustees with the advice of the local school health advisory council and:

SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026 school year.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
