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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the licensing and regulation of advanced practice
3 registered nurses and the number of advanced practice registered
4 nurses and physician assistants with whom a physician may enter
5 into a prescriptive authority agreement.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

ARTICLE 1. SHORT TITLE

8 SECTION 1.001. This Act may be cited as the Healthcare
9 Expanded and Accessed Locally for Texans (HEAL Texans) Act.

10 ARTICLE 2. REGULATION OF ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES

11 SECTION 2.001. Section 301.002, Occupations Code, is
12 amended to read as follows:

13 Sec. 301.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

19 (3) [~~(1-a)~~] "Chief nursing officer" means the
20 registered nurse who is administratively responsible for the
21 nursing services at a facility.

24 (5) "Dangerous drug" has the meaning assigned by

1 Section 483.001, Health and Safety Code.

2 (6) "Device" has the meaning assigned by Section
3 551.003, and includes durable medical equipment.

4 (7) "Nonprescription drug" has the meaning assigned by
5 Section 551.003.

6 (8) "Nurse" means a person required to be licensed
7 under this chapter to engage in professional or vocational nursing.

8 (9) "Nursing" means professional or vocational
9 nursing.

10 (10) [(-b)] "Patient safety committee" has the
11 meaning assigned by Section 303.001.

12 (11) "Prescribe or order a drug or device" has the
13 meaning assigned by Section 157.051.

14 (12) [(-2)] "Professional nursing" means the
15 performance of an act that requires substantial specialized
16 judgment and skill, the proper performance of which is based on
17 knowledge and application of the principles of biological,
18 physical, and social science as acquired by a completed course in an
19 approved school of professional nursing. The term does not include
20 acts of medical diagnosis or the prescription of therapeutic or
21 corrective measures, except as performed by an advanced practice
22 registered nurse authorized to practice by the board under Section
23 301.357. Professional nursing involves:

24 (A) the observation, assessment, intervention,
25 evaluation, rehabilitation, care and counsel, or health teachings
26 of a person who is ill, injured, infirm, or experiencing a change in
27 normal health processes;

(B) the maintenance of health or prevention of
illness:

3 (C) the administration of a medication or
4 treatment as ordered by a health care practitioner legally
5 authorized to prescribe the medication or treatment [physician,
6 pediatrician, or dentist]:

7 (D) the supervision or teaching of nursing;

8 (E) the administration, supervision, and
9 evaluation of nursing practices, policies, and procedures;

10 (F) the requesting, receiving, signing for, and
11 distribution of prescription drug samples to patients at practices
12 at which an advanced practice registered nurse is authorized to
13 sign prescription drug orders as provided by Subchapter **B**, Chapter
14 [157](#);

15 (G) the performance by an advanced practice
16 registered nurse of an act delegated by a physician under Section
17 157.0512, 157.054, 157.058, or 157.059; [and]

18 (H) the development of the nursing care plan; and

22 [(3) "Nurse" means a person required to be licensed
23 under this chapter to engage in professional or vocational nursing.

24 [(4) "Nursing" means professional or vocational
25 nursing]

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1 requires specialized judgment and skill, the proper performance of
2 which is based on knowledge and application of the principles of
3 biological, physical, and social science as acquired by a completed
4 course in an approved school of vocational nursing. The term does
5 not include acts of medical diagnosis or the prescription of
6 therapeutic or corrective measures. Vocational nursing involves:

7 (A) collecting data and performing focused
8 nursing assessments of the health status of an individual;

9 (B) participating in the planning of the nursing
10 care needs of an individual;

11 (C) participating in the development and
12 modification of the nursing care plan;

13 (D) participating in health teaching and
14 counseling to promote, attain, and maintain the optimum health
15 level of an individual;

16 (E) assisting in the evaluation of an
17 individual's response to a nursing intervention and the
18 identification of an individual's needs; and

19 (F) engaging in other acts that require education
20 and training, as prescribed by board rules and policies,
21 commensurate with the nurse's experience, continuing education,
22 and demonstrated competency.

23 SECTION 2.002. Section 301.005(b), Occupations Code, is
24 amended to read as follows:

25 (b) A reference in any other law to an "advanced nurse
26 practitioner," [~~practitioner~~ or] "advanced practice nurse," or
27 "advanced practice registered nurse" means an advanced practice

1 registered nurse.

2 SECTION 2.003. Sections 301.152(a) and (b), Occupations
3 Code, are amended to read as follows:

4 (a) [In this section, "advanced practice registered nurse"
5 means a registered nurse licensed by the board to practice as an
6 advanced practice registered nurse on the basis of completion of an
7 advanced educational program.] The term "advanced practice
8 registered nurse" includes a nurse practitioner, nurse midwife,
9 nurse anesthetist, and clinical nurse specialist. [The term is
10 synonymous with "advanced nurse practitioner" and "advanced
11 practice nurse."]

12 (b) The board shall adopt rules to:

13 (1) license a registered nurse as an advanced practice
14 registered nurse;

15 (2) establish:

16 (A) any specialized education or training,
17 including pharmacology, that an advanced practice registered nurse
18 must have to prescribe or order a drug or device as delegated by a
19 physician under Section 157.0512 or 157.054 or authorized by the
20 board under Section 301.358;

21 (B) a system for approving an advanced practice
22 registered nurse to prescribe or order a drug or device as delegated
23 by a physician under Section 157.0512 or 157.054 or authorized by
24 the board under Section 301.358 on the receipt of evidence of
25 completing the specialized education and training requirement
26 under Paragraph (A); and

27 (C) a system for issuing a prescription

1 authorization number to an advanced practice registered nurse
2 approved under Paragraph (B); and

3 (3) concurrently renew any license or approval granted
4 to an advanced practice registered nurse under this subsection and
5 a license renewed by the advanced practice registered nurse under
6 Section [301.301](#).

7 SECTION 2.004. Section [301.303](#)(b), Occupations Code, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 (b) Except as provided by a rule adopted under Section
10 301.357(h) for an advanced practice registered nurse authorized by
11 the board to practice under that section, the [The] board may not
12 require participation in more than a total of 20 hours of continuing
13 education in a two-year licensing period.

14 SECTION 2.005. Subchapter [H](#), Chapter [301](#), Occupations Code,
15 is amended by adding Sections 301.357, 301.358, and 301.359 to read
16 as follows:

17 Sec. 301.357. INDEPENDENT PRACTICE BY CERTAIN ADVANCED
18 PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES. (a) The board shall authorize the
19 practice under this section of an advanced practice registered
20 nurse who applies for authorization under this section in the
21 manner prescribed by the board and who:

22 (1) is a nurse practitioner, nurse midwife, or
23 clinical nurse specialist; and

24 (2) either:

25 (A) has held an active unencumbered license as an
26 advanced practice registered nurse in any state for at least 10
27 years or 20,000 hours, as determined by the board; or

1 (B) has:

2 (i) graduated from a program of nursing
3 education that has a physical presence in this state and has a
4 requirement of in-person clinical experience; and

9 **(b) To be eligible for authorization to practice under this**
10 section, an applicant described by Subsection (a) must:

25 (1) ordering, performing, and interpreting diagnostic
26 tests;

27 (2) formulating primary and differential medical

1 diagnoses and advanced assessments;
2 (3) treating actual and potential health problems;
3 (4) prescribing therapeutic and corrective measures,
4 including nutrition and diagnostic support services, home health
5 care, hospice care, physical therapy, and occupational therapy, and
6 delegating and assigning the performance of therapeutic and
7 corrective measures to assistive personnel;
8 (5) to the extent authorized by the board under
9 Section 301.358, prescribing, ordering, procuring, administering,
10 and dispensing drugs and devices, including blood and blood
11 products, controlled substances listed in Schedules III, IV, and V,
12 dangerous drugs, and nonprescription drugs;
13 (6) providing referrals to health care agencies,
14 health care providers, and community resources;
15 (7) serving as a primary care provider of record; and
16 (8) performing other acts that require education and
17 training consistent with professional standards and that are
18 commensurate with the advanced practice registered nurse's
19 education, licensure, and demonstrated competencies and
20 experience.
21 (d) Subject to Subsection (e), an advanced practice
22 registered nurse authorized to practice under this section shall
23 practice as a licensed independent practitioner in accordance with
24 standards established and recognized by the board to protect the
25 public health and safety.
26 (e) An advanced practice registered nurse authorized to
27 practice under this section may practice as a licensed independent

1 practitioner only in a county with a population of less than 68,750.

2 (f) An advanced practice registered nurse authorized to
3 practice under this section is accountable to patients, the nursing
4 profession, and the board for:

5 (1) complying with the requirements of this chapter;
6 (2) providing quality advanced nursing care;
7 (3) recognizing the limits of the nurse's knowledge;
8 (4) planning for the management of situations beyond
9 the nurse's expertise; and

10 (5) consulting with or referring patients to other
11 health care providers as appropriate.

12 (g) This section does not limit or modify the scope of
13 practice of a nurse who is not authorized to practice under this
14 section.

15 (h) The board by rule shall establish:

16 (1) the application process for authorization to
17 practice under this section;

18 (2) a requirement that an advanced practice registered
19 nurse authorized to practice under this section complete at least
20 48 hours of continuing education, including 10 hours of continuing
21 education in pharmacology, every two years; and

22 (3) systems to:

23 (A) authorize an advanced practice registered
24 nurse to prescribe or order a drug or device under Section 301.358
25 when the board receives evidence of the completion of any education
26 or training required by board rule; and

27 (B) concurrently renew for an advanced practice

1 registered nurse:

2 (i) an authorization issued under this
3 section or Section 301.358; and
4 (ii) a license issued under rules adopted
5 under Section 301.152 or renewed under Section 301.301.

12 Sec. 301.359. REPORT TO BOARD. (a) An advanced practice
13 registered nurse authorized to practice by the board under Section
14 301.357 shall, not later than January 15 of each year, submit to the
15 board a report that includes for the preceding calendar year:

22 (3) the number of instances in which the advanced
23 practice registered nurse:

24 (A) referred the patient to a physician for the
25 prescription of a controlled substance listed in Schedule II; or

1 with a physician.

2 (b) An advanced practice registered nurse authorized to
3 practice by the board under Section 301.357 shall notify the board
4 if the advanced practice registered nurse practices as an
5 independent practitioner at a location other than the practice
6 setting identified in the report submitted to the board under
7 Subsection (a) for the previous calendar year.

8 (c) The board shall annually aggregate, anonymize, and
9 publish on the board's Internet website the information submitted
10 by each advanced practice registered nurse under Subsection (a).

11 ARTICLE 3. DELEGATION AND PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY AGREEMENTS

12 SECTION 3.001. Section 157.0512(c), Occupations Code, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), the combined
15 number of advanced practice registered nurses and physician
16 assistants with whom a physician may enter into a prescriptive
17 authority agreement may not exceed nine [~~seven~~] advanced practice
18 registered nurses and physician assistants or the full-time
19 equivalent of seven advanced practice registered nurses and
20 physician assistants.

21 SECTION 3.002. Chapter 157, Occupations Code, is amended by
22 adding Subchapter D to read as follows:

23 SUBCHAPTER D. DELEGATION AGREEMENTS WITH

24 ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES

25 Sec. 157.151. NONDISCLOSURE AGREEMENTS. A delegation
26 agreement, including a prescriptive authority agreement, between a
27 physician and an advanced practice registered nurse may not include

1 or be the subject of a nondisclosure agreement.

2 Sec. 157.152. REPORTING BY PHYSICIAN; REPORT TO BOARD. (a)
3 A physician who enters into a delegation agreement with an advanced
4 practice registered nurse, including a prescriptive authority
5 agreement under Section 157.0512, shall, not later than January 15
6 of each year, submit to the board a report that includes for the
7 preceding calendar year:

8 (1) the amount of any fee the physician charges the
9 advanced practice registered nurse to enter into the agreement;

10 (2) any restriction or limitation the physician places
11 on the advanced practice registered nurse's practice under the
12 agreement;

13 (3) any instance in which the physician changes the
14 diagnosis or course of treatment of a patient of the advanced
15 practice registered nurse; and

16 (4) the number of case files the physician reviews
17 each month.

18 (b) The board shall annually aggregate, anonymize, and
19 publish on the board's Internet website the information submitted
20 by each physician under Subsection (a).

21 Sec. 157.153. COMPLAINT REGARDING ADVANCED PRACTICE
22 REGISTERED NURSE UNDER DELEGATION AGREEMENT. (a) The board shall
23 disaggregate from information the board maintains regarding
24 complaints against a physician any information regarding a
25 complaint against an advanced practice registered nurse practicing
26 under a delegation agreement with the physician.

27 (b) The board shall separately maintain information

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1 regarding complaints against an advanced practice registered nurse
2 practicing under a delegation agreement with the physician. The
3 information maintained under this subsection must include:

20 may prescribe epinephrine auto-injectors or medication for
21 respiratory distress in the name of a school district,
22 open-enrollment charter school, or private school.

23 SECTION 4.003. Section 38.225(a), Education Code, is
24 amended to read as follows:

25 (a) A physician, a [or] person who has been delegated
26 prescriptive authority under Chapter 157, Occupations Code, or an
27 advanced practice registered nurse authorized to prescribe and

1 order drugs and devices under Section 301.358, Occupations Code,
2 may prescribe opioid antagonists in the name of a school district,
3 open-enrollment charter school, or private school.

4 SECTION 4.004. Section 61.601, Education Code, is amended
5 to read as follows:

6 Sec. 61.601. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "mental
7 health professional" means:

8 (1) a licensed physician who is:

9 (A) a graduate of an accredited psychiatric
10 residency training program; or

11 (B) certified in psychiatry by:

12 (i) the American Board of Psychiatry and
13 Neurology; or

14 (ii) the American Osteopathic Board of
15 Neurology and Psychiatry;

16 (2) a psychologist, as defined by Section 501.002,
17 Occupations Code;

18 (3) a licensed professional counselor, as defined by
19 Section 503.002, Occupations Code;

20 (4) an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined
21 by Section 301.002 [301.152], Occupations Code, who holds a
22 nationally recognized board certification in psychiatric or mental
23 health nursing;

24 (5) a licensed clinical social worker, as defined by
25 Section 505.002, Occupations Code;

26 (6) a licensed specialist in school psychology, as
27 defined by Section 501.002, Occupations Code;

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5 SECTION 4.005. Section 1101.100(1), Estates Code, is
6 amended to read as follows:

9 SECTION 4.006. Section 671.001(b), Government Code, is
10 amended to read as follows:

11 (b) The pilot program must provide for the following:

10 (a) In this section, "midwife" has the meaning assigned by
11 Section [203.002](#), Occupations Code, and includes a nurse midwife
12 [~~described by Section 301.152, Occupations Code~~].

13 SECTION 4.008. Sections [161.0052](#)(b) and (c), Health and
14 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

15 (b) The executive commissioner by rule shall require a
16 hospital to inform each elderly person admitted to the hospital for
17 a period of 24 hours or more that the pneumococcal and influenza
18 vaccines are available. If the elderly person requests a vaccine,
19 and if a physician, or an advanced practice registered nurse
20 [~~practitioner~~] or physician assistant on behalf of a physician, or
21 an advanced practice registered nurse authorized to prescribe and
22 order drugs and devices under Section 301.358, Occupations Code,
23 determines that the vaccine is in the person's best interest, the
24 hospital must make the vaccination available to the person before
25 the person is discharged from the hospital.

26 (c) The executive commissioner by rule shall require an end
27 stage renal disease facility to offer, to the extent possible as

1 determined by the facility, the opportunity to receive the
2 pneumococcal and influenza vaccines to each elderly person who
3 receives ongoing care at the facility if a physician, or an advanced
4 practice registered nurse [~~practitioner~~] or physician assistant on
5 behalf of a physician, or an advanced practice registered nurse
6 authorized to prescribe and order drugs and devices under Section
7 301.358, Occupations Code, determines that the vaccine is in the
8 person's best interest. If the facility decides it is not feasible
9 to offer the vaccine, the facility must provide the person with
10 information on other options for obtaining the vaccine.

11 SECTION 4.009. Section 401.504(d), Health and Safety Code,
12 is amended to read as follows:

13 (d) This subchapter does not apply to a physician, [or to] a
14 physician's employee or delegate acting under Chapter 157,
15 Occupations Code, or an advanced practice registered nurse
16 authorized to prescribe and order drugs and devices under Section
17 301.358, Occupations Code.

18 SECTION 4.010. Section 481.002(39), Health and Safety Code,
19 is amended to read as follows:

20 (39) "Practitioner" means:

21 (A) a physician, dentist, veterinarian,
22 podiatrist, scientific investigator, advanced practice registered
23 nurse authorized to prescribe and order drugs and devices under
24 Section 301.358, Occupations Code, or other person licensed,
25 registered, or otherwise permitted to distribute, dispense,
26 analyze, conduct research with respect to, or administer a
27 controlled substance in the course of professional practice or

1 research in this state;

2 (B) a pharmacy, hospital, or other institution
3 licensed, registered, or otherwise permitted to distribute,
4 dispense, conduct research with respect to, or administer a
5 controlled substance in the course of professional practice or
6 research in this state;

7 (C) a person practicing in and licensed by
8 another state as a physician, dentist, veterinarian, advanced
practice registered nurse, or podiatrist, having a current Federal
10 Drug Enforcement Administration registration number, who may
11 legally prescribe Schedule II, III, IV, or V controlled substances
12 in that state; or

13 (D) an advanced practice registered nurse or
14 physician assistant to whom a physician has delegated the authority
15 to prescribe or order a drug or device under Section [157.0511](#),
16 [157.0512](#), or [157.054](#), Occupations Code.

17 SECTION 4.011. Section [481.074](#)(d), Health and Safety Code,
18 is amended to read as follows:

19 (d) Except as specified in Subsections (e) and (f), the
20 board, by rule and in consultation with the Texas Medical Board and
21 the Texas Board of Nursing, shall establish the period after the
22 date on which the prescription is issued that a person may fill a
23 prescription for a controlled substance listed in Schedule II. A
24 person may not refill a prescription for a substance listed in
25 Schedule II.

26 SECTION 4.012. Section [481.076](#)(c), Health and Safety Code,
27 is amended to read as follows:

15 pharmacist, or other individual designated by a practitioner to
16 communicate prescription drug orders to a pharmacist;
17 (B) a licensed nurse, physician assistant, or
18 pharmacist employed in a health care facility to whom the
19 practitioner communicates a prescription drug order; or
20 (C) an advanced practice [a] registered nurse or
21 physician assistant authorized by a practitioner to carry out a
22 prescription drug order for dangerous drugs under Subchapter B,
23 Chapter 157, Occupations Code.

24 (12) "Practitioner" means:
25 (A) a person licensed by:
26 (i) the Texas Medical Board, State Board of
27 Dental Examiners, Texas Optometry Board, or State Board of

1 Veterinary Medical Examiners to prescribe and administer dangerous
2 drugs; or

3 (ii) the Texas Department of Licensing and
4 Regulation, with respect to podiatry, to prescribe and administer
5 dangerous drugs;

6 (B) a person licensed by another state in a
7 health field in which, under the laws of this state, a licensee may
8 legally prescribe dangerous drugs;

9 (C) a person licensed in Canada or Mexico in a
10 health field in which, under the laws of this state, a licensee may
11 legally prescribe dangerous drugs; ~~[or]~~

12 (D) an advanced practice registered nurse or
13 physician assistant to whom a physician has delegated the authority
14 to prescribe or order a drug or device under Section [157.0511](#),
15 [157.0512](#), or [157.054](#), Occupations Code; or

16 (E) an advanced practice registered nurse
17 authorized to prescribe and order drugs and devices under Section
18 301.358, Occupations Code.

19 (13) "Prescription" means an order from a
20 practitioner, or an agent of the practitioner designated in writing
21 as authorized to communicate prescriptions, or an order made in
22 accordance with Subchapter B, Chapter [157](#), Occupations Code, or
23 Section [203.353](#), Occupations Code, to a pharmacist for a dangerous
24 drug to be dispensed that states:

25 (A) the date of the order's issue;
26 (B) the name and address of the patient;
27 (C) if the drug is prescribed for an animal, the

1 species of the animal;

2 (D) the name and quantity of the drug prescribed;

3 (E) the directions for the use of the drug;

4 (F) the intended use of the drug unless the

5 practitioner determines the furnishing of this information is not

6 in the best interest of the patient;

7 (G) the name, address, and telephone number of

8 the practitioner at the practitioner's usual place of business,

9 legibly printed or stamped; and

10 (H) the name, address, and telephone number of

11 the licensed midwife, advanced practice registered nurse, or

12 physician assistant, legibly printed or stamped, if signed by a

13 licensed midwife, advanced practice registered nurse, or physician

14 assistant.

15 SECTION 4.015. Section 483.022(f), Health and Safety Code,
16 is amended to read as follows:

17 (f) A practitioner may designate a person who is a licensed
18 vocational nurse or has an education equivalent to or greater than
19 that required for a licensed vocational nurse to communicate
20 prescriptions of an advanced practice registered nurse or physician
21 assistant authorized by the practitioner to sign prescription drug
22 orders under Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code, or of an
23 advanced practice registered nurse authorized to prescribe and
24 order drugs and devices under Section 301.358, Occupations Code.

25 SECTION 4.016. Section 483.042(a), Health and Safety Code,
26 is amended to read as follows:

27 (a) A person commits an offense if the person delivers or

1 offers to deliver a dangerous drug:

2 (1) unless:

3 (A) the dangerous drug is delivered or offered
4 for delivery by a pharmacist under:

5 (i) a prescription issued by a practitioner
6 described by Section 483.001(12)(A) L ~~[or]~~ (B), or (E);

7 (ii) a prescription signed by an advanced
8 practice ~~[a]~~ registered nurse or physician assistant in accordance
9 with Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code; or

10 (iii) an original written prescription
11 issued by a practitioner described by Section 483.001(12)(C); and

12 (B) a label is attached to the immediate

6 ARTICLE 5. LEGISLATION IMPACT STUDY

7 SECTION 5.001. (a) The Texas Board of Nursing shall conduct
8 a study of the effect this Act has had on:

9 (1) access to primary health care in counties with a
10 population of less than 68,750 as compared to counties with a
11 population of 68,750 or greater;

12 (2) patient outcomes in counties with a population of
13 less than 68,750;

14 (3) trends in the practice location of advanced
15 practice registered nurses; and

16 (4) costs incurred by rural hospitals.

17 (b) Not later than September 1, 2028, the Texas Board of
18 Nursing shall submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and
19 the speaker of the house of representatives:

20 (1) the study conducted under Subsection (a) of this
21 section;

22 (2) the information published by:

23 (A) the Texas Medical Board under Section
24 157.152(b), Occupations Code, as added by this Act; and

25 (B) the Texas Board of Nursing under Section
26 301.359(c), Occupations Code, as added by this Act; and

27 (3) recommendations to the legislature to improve

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1 rural access to health care and patient outcomes.

3 ARTICLE 6. TRANSITION AND EFFECTIVE DATE

4 SECTION 6.001. Not later than February 1, 2026, the Texas
5 Board of Nursing shall adopt the rules necessary to implement the
6 changes in law made by this Act.

7 SECTION 6.002. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
