The Senate suspended the necessary rules to consider and finally pass:

SJR 4 (CS) Schwertner

Proposing a constitutional amendment providing for the maximum amount of money allowable in the economic stabilization fund.

Proposing a constitutional amendment regarding the powers of the governor, the legislature, and the supreme court following certain disaster or emergency declarations.

SB 36 (CS) (LC) Parker/ et al.

Relating to the homeland security activities of certain entities, including the establishment and operations of the Homeland Security Division in the Department of Public Safety.

SB 249 (CS) (LC) Flores/ et al.

Relating to memorial markers for certain officers killed in the line of duty.

SB 311 (LC) Hughes

Relating to the writ power of the Texas Supreme Court.

Relating to the period for which an applicant for admission as an undergraduate student to a public institution of higher education is entitled to an academic fresh start.

Relating to enhancing the criminal penalty for the offense of intoxication manslaughter in certain circumstances.

Relating to the regulation of new HUD-code manufactured housing.

Relating to the regulation of mold assessors and remediators.

Relating to certain duties of the Texas Workforce Commission with respect to child-care resources.

SB 1271 (CS) **Hancock/ et al.**
Relating to the concurrent jurisdiction of this state over United States military installations with respect to certain subject matters.

SB 1313 (CS) **Cook/ et al.**
Relating to prohibited signs, logos, and designs in advertising or marketing cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or other tobacco products; creating a criminal offense.

SB 1316 (LC) **Cook/ et al.**
Relating to a prohibition on e-cigarette advertising in certain locations.

SB 1318 (LC) **Schwertner/ et al.**
Relating to restrictions on covenants not to compete for physicians and certain health care practitioners.

Relating to vehicle registration, license plates, and inspection reports.

Relating to an application for a ballot to be voted by mail submitted by certain residents of an assisted living facility, a nursing facility, or an intermediate care facility.

SB 883 **Paxton/ Hall/ et al.**

Relating to patient access to prescription drugs for off-label use for COVID-19 treatment.

SB 1059 **Parker/ Bettencourt/ Hall/
Hinojosa, Adam**

Relating to the authority of the governing body of a home-rule municipality to submit a proposed charter amendment to the voters for approval if application of the provisions of the amendment would be contrary to state law.

SB 1210 (LC) **Hughes**

Relating to the jurisdiction of the Texas Supreme Court and the Court of Criminal Appeals.
